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NEW MEXICO NEWS

Judge John R. McFie in chambers at Santa Fe yesterday signed judgment in favor of Simon Sanders & Co., for \$273.20 against Jennie Berardinelli, and in favor of Joe E. Lacombe, for \$102.87 against A. S. Bushkevitz.

Upon the request of the republican county central committee of Taos county, Governor Curry has decided to appoint Romulo Martinez of Questa to the vacant county commissionership from that district. Mr. Martinez was very highly recommended.

District Clerk Frank W. Shearon of Santa Fe, has computed the costs to be added to the \$25 fine imposed upon the eight defendants in the case of the Castilla Land & Investment company vs. Robert Allen, et al., for contempt of court, the costs in each case amounting to \$18.50.

Mounted Policeman Fred Higginson, Roswell, has reported the following arrests to the headquarters of mounted police at the capitol: S. Burnett, shooting cattle, held in bond; Seferino Quellas, Marcos Corona and Tomasa Martinez arrested on the block ranch, Lincoln county, horse stealing and holding in jail.

Mrs. C. F. Ripburger, burned and the interior of her cleaning establishment gutted by fire yesterday 9:30 o'clock. Mrs. Ripburger was extinguished by a fire in the building in which she was conducting business.

The preliminary hearing of the case of the late Judge John W. White, set for January 1st, will be held before Judge John W. White, Jr., at Lyden, Rio Arriba county, where the late judge was committed to the custody of the sheriff of that county.

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Los Angeles, Dec. 30.—In the belief that her 18-year-old daughter, Bessie May Priest, was poisoned, Mrs. Jeanne Priest has asked the district attorney to investigate the death of the young woman which occurred in Glendale Christmas eve after an illness lasting twenty days. It is alleged by the mother that Miss Priest was engaged to Harry Sayre, a Newark, N. J., millionaire's son and that she had a rival in the person of a woman whose identity is being concealed.

Washington, Dec. 30.—Among the first official acts of Baron Uchida, the new Japanese ambassador, it is said, will be a series of steps leading to a proposal to the United States for a modification of the Root-Takahira agreement, which imposed limitations on the immigration of laborers to the United States.

Washington, Dec. 30.—Governor Enrique Creel, special envoy from Mexico to the United States in the Nicaraguan affair, gave the Associated Press today a statement regarding his mission to this country. Governor Creel declared that he had accomplished his task with gratifying results. The resignation of Zelaga and the succession of President Madriz, has ended many difficulties and prevented anarchy.

London, Dec. 30.—A duel fought in Paris has resulted fatally. Earl Percy, a British nobleman, was killed in a duel fought in Paris several days ago. The death of the Earl has created a sensation. No proof is obtainable that death was due to other than natural causes, though rumors of a personal encounter between Percy and another Englishman are being persistently circulated.
