COUNTY COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

(Continued from Yesterday)

In consideration for such services for the period the party of the second part agrees to pay to the said party of the second part the sum of Seventy-Five (\$75.00) Dollars, and in addition to pay to the said party of the second part the sum of twenty-five cents for the vaccination of each resident of the county, save those heretofore excepted from the terms of this contract, who is not financially able to pay for the cost of vaccination. The party of the first part disclaims any responsibility for the payment of vaccination charges as to those who are able to pay for the same. The party of the second part hereto agrees to render to the party of the first part, at its regular meeting of April 3rd, 1911, a statement of the names, ages and residence of all indigent persons vaccinated at the cost of the county, and further, to render to the said party of the first part a detailed statement of the work as health officer during the said period.

In the matter of building bridges over the Rio Pecos at San Jose, over the Arroyo Pecos near Las Vegas, on the Los Alamos road and at Hot Springs where the boulevard crosses the Rio Gallinas.

Whereas at the regular session of this board, February 6-7, 1911, there were filed before this board petitions signed in each instance by more than five hundred, legal taxpayers and property owners of the county of San Miguel, territory of New Mexico praying that bridges be built in accordance with the provisions of the law governing the same over the Rio Pecos at San Jose, over the Arroyo Pecos at a point near which the present road from East Las Vegas to Los Alamos crosses the said Arroyo Pecos, and at a point on the Hot Springs boulevard where the said Hot Springs boulevard crosses the Rio Gallinas, and whereas the county commissioners of the said county have inspected the proposed locations and find that all the said locations

are within the limits of the county of San Miguel and territory of New Mexico, and whereas this board finds that the said three petitions are all in accordance with law and that the cost of building the said bridges is not in excess of the amount that will be realized by the tax levy for the year 1911 in the said county at San Miguel, therefore be it,

Resolved, that the said petitions be severally approved and that advertisements calling for bids for the building of the said three bridges with plans and specifications attached be published for four consecutive weeks in El Independiente, in Spanish and in the Las Vegas Daily Optic in English once a week on the same day of the week for four consecutive weeks, both of said papers being published in the county of San Miguel, New Mexico, the first named paper being a Spanish and the last named an English publication and that all steps proper to be taken for the building of said bridges be hereafter taken by this board, and it is further;

Resolved; that each bidder be required to bid upon the construction of said three bridges and not upon one or two or three bridges and that the said advertisements so specify. Adopted this March 8th, 1911, in regular session of the board of county commissioners of the county of San Miguel.
