FOUND DEAD.

An Old Woman, Added to Drink, Cold in the morning about 7 o'clock, J. Zamora, who keeps a store and saloon in the Sanchez building, on South Second street, while opening his place of business, happened to go out of a side door, opening on an empty lot, when he discovered a woman, fully dressed, half sitting and crawling against the side of the building. He went up and took hold of her arm, but found that she was stiff and cold in death. Zamora at once sent word down town, and Constable J. H. Smith immediately repaired to the scene. The body was found to be that of one Mrs. Elena Medina, a native, about 60 years of age, who had lived here for a long time. She occupied a room in the building against which her body was found, renting from Mrs. Sanchez. The body was taken to the undertaking rooms and Justice Ribble at once impelled a jury to hold an inquest. From the evidence given it was shown that Mrs. Medina was afflicted with the excessive use of alcohol, and in a saloon last night in the neighborhood, about 10 o'clock, considerably under the influence of intoxicants. She was not again seen until her body was found this morning. She lived alone, having for a long time been separated from her husband. She had no children, but a brother lives here. He states that he saw her last few days ago, and which time she was in her usual state of health. He could give no information as to the cause of her death. The jury viewed the remains and adjourned the inquest until next morning. Witnesses could be found who had seen the woman between 10 o'clock last night and the time the body was found this morning.

DEATH FROM CONSUMPTION.

At 4:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon, W. W. Wiseman, aged 32 years, formerly chief clerk of a water company in Montana, died in his apartment on North Seventh street of consumption, after a lingering illness of several months. His brother, of Clifton, Arizona, was notified by telegraph yesterday evening of the sad occurrence, and he boarded a train at once and started for this place, arriving here on this morning's early train. Funeral services were conducted over the dead body this afternoon at the burial parlors of J. W. Edwards, and the burial took place in Fairview cemetery.

Mr. Patrick said further that it was as good a carnival as El Paso deserves. He infers that the most underrating people he ever met. They mistake him for a bandit." A representative of The Citizen visited El Paso during the carnival, remaining long enough to call Mr. Benham down on his assertion that "there were no street decorations and no legitimate attractions." Almost every business house was decorated with the prevailing colors—red, orange and green, and some of the decorations were indeed very neatly executed. And as for attractions, look at this list: The French theatre, Court of Nero; Sappho with visions of the roses; the acrobatic flying lady, the marvel of the 20th century; Busco, the snake eater; Sapp, the ossified man, who has not moved for 40 years; L. E. Bency, his peerless winged dancer; a Trip to the Orient, and last but not least, "Have You Seen George?" Who will make you laugh. All these midway features were located in the center of El Paso, and they surely ought to have been sufficient to have kept the two Phoenix gentlemen pleased with their stay there.

HOSS CARELESSNESS.

Driver of Delivery Wagon Causes a Six-Year-Old Child's Suffering. At noon to-day, Perfecto Luna, a 6-year-old lad, while crossing the street at Sixth and Terasa avenue, was the victim of an accident. He was knocked down by a delivery wagon, and the little fellow was carried into the residence of W. Y. Walton and remained unconscious for about thirty minutes. Dr. Phillips was summoned and treated the child, but he was unable to find any bones broken, and the child was considered dangerous. The boy was taken to his home near the government Indian school, where he was nursed. The driver of the delivery wagon did not stop when the accident occurred, but made haste to get out of that neighborhood as quickly as possible. Several people who witnessed the accident declared that it was caused by the careless driving of the man in the wagon. The driver's name is not positively known, but should the injuries of the child prove serious, it is not at all improbable that he will have a grave charge to face.
