

THE LEGISLATURE

The council and house of the thirty-fourth legislative assembly reconvened at 10 o'clock yesterday morning.

After the opening preliminary, Mr. Hughes presented council joint memorial No. 2, formally extending an urgent invitation to President McKinley to pay a visit to the principal cities of New Mexico on the occasion of his visit to the west in May next. It was unanimously adopted.

Committee reports being in order, council bill No. 9 was reported with amendments and passed. This is Mr. Hinkle's very comprehensive measure which utilizes the land donated by congress in aid of the New Mexico military school at Roswell as a basis for the issuance of \$50,000 in bonds for the construction of new buildings for that institution.

Council bill No. 22, Mr. Martinez's bill, relating to delinquent tax sales, was also favorably reported and passed.

Council bill No. 13, with amendments, an act to amend section 53, session laws of 1899, was reported and given a place on the president's table.

Mr. Martinez introduced council bill No. 25, a bill authorizing the governor to fill all vacancies among county officers, by appointment, the same to hold good until their successors are elected.

In the house Mr. Winston presented a protest signed by the merchants of Hillsboro against the appointment of Mr. Reed's house bill No. 4, providing a license for peddlers.

The following bills were introduced, ordered translated and printed and referred to the proper committees:

House bill No. 74, by Mr. Martinez, to amend section 418, Compiled Laws of 1897, occupation tax; judiciary committee.

House bill No. 75, by Mr. Abbott, authorizing the supreme court to fix the time for holding sessions of the supreme and district courts; committee on judiciary.

House bill No. 76, by Mr. Abbott, to amend sections 1623 and 1674, Compiled Laws of 1897, defining duties of judges and clerks of election and county commissioners; committee on privileges and elections.

House bill No. 77, by Mr. Abbott, to amend section 607 of chapter 31, title 41, Compiled Laws of 1897, changing the tax levy for current county expenses; committee on public institutions.

House bill No. 78, by Mr. Barnes, an act to promote purity of elections, to preserve the secrecy of the ballot and to provide for the printing and distribution of ballots; committee on judiciary.

House bill No. 79, by Mr. Bateson, an act to amend section 75, session laws of 1899, relating to municipal bond issues; committee on territorial affairs.

House bill No. 80, by Mr. Bateson, to create and establish an institution for the blind near Chamita, Rio Arriba county; committee on public institutions.

House bill No. 81, by Mr. Bateson, to amend sub-sections 4124 and 4122, Compiled Laws of 1897; judiciary.

House bill No. 82, by Mr. Bateson, an act relating to the appointment of health officers; committee on judiciary.

House bill No. 83, by Mr. Bateson, to provide for superintendence of lateral flow from community ditches; committee on irrigation.

House bill No. 84, by Mr. Bateson, relating to public roads; committee on territorial affairs.

House bill No. 85, by Mr. C. Sanchez, an act to amend section 4124, Compiled Laws of 1897, relating to the territory of New Mexico; committee on finance.

Mr. Barnes offered a resolution providing that 300 instead of 100 copies of a bill be printed for the use of members of the house. Mr. Walton moved to amend by making the number 25, which was carried and the resolution was adopted.

Mr. Bateson called up council bill No. 25, authorizing the governor to fill by appointment all vacancies among county officers occasioned by death, resignation or otherwise, until such time as their successors shall be duly appointed. The measure was duly passed by a vote of 20 to 2.
