SHEEP ON FOREST RESERVES.
The action of the administration in permitting some 150,000 sheep to be run on the Big Horn forest reserve in northern Wyoming will be approved by western men. Within certain limits grazing sheep on the forest reserves is not injurious, and as far as that is true the pastures of such forests should be placed at the disposal of stockgrowers.

The subject has been investigated by the department of agriculture and it seems that a forest pasture may in some cases be permitted with safety. In a forest of large trees there is less reason to protect the young tree shoots than in cases where the growth has been destroyed by fire or other means.

COLLEGE FAILURES.
It is advantageous to deposit money in the hands of a responsible party, and to utilize such an education. Unfortunately, observes the Los Angeles Times, such a view of the case is seldom considered by parents and guardians who are inclined to send their children to college simply because it is considered the proper thing to do. Consequently we find throughout the country thousands of young men who have passed through college acting as cheap clerks or bookkeepers, or even as car conductors and restaurant waiters. Having learned no mechanical trade, for which they may well be adapted, and being untaught by nature for a profession, they go through life discontented with their lot and vaguely believing that the world owes them better treatment because they have gone through college.

ABOUT ARIZONA.
The development of Arizona, says the Los Angeles Herald, within the last ten years makes a splendid showing in the census for 1900. In all branches of business there is remarkable percentage of increase, but the most noticeable feature in the growth of the copper mining industry.
