Delate Monday says: A poll of the senate shows a majority in favor of the admission of New Mexico, and the lower house will probably follow working plans which enable owners to manage their forests with a view to maintaining a constant supply of timber. The timber is cut according to our plans—a limit being placed upon the amount felled—and consequently owners under the proposed system, have a continuous supply of timber instead of a sudden and fatal exhaustion. There are two kinds of wood for the supply of which there is an enormous demand. They are the white pine of the New England and Great Lake region and the yellow pine of the south. If the present policy of cutting is continued, the trees located in the vast tracts now being denuded must either be re-planted or the supply will exhaust itself. There is no computing the exact time when our timber supply will have been completely exhausted.
