Commissioners Make

Review of County Road

M. M. Killinger and Chas. L. Hubbard, Luna County Commissioners reviewed the graded highway leading from Deming to Columbus. They left Deming Sunday morning, via of Hondale and Iola with a view of improving the roads in that direction also.

They were accompanied by S. B. Rhea and Leon Godchaux, who have been instrumental in raising quite a sum of money from the farmers south of Deming to be used in road improvement.

In conversation with the commissioners they stated that they would recommend the improving and bettering of the graded road leading from the Mexico line north as far as Deming. A number of bridges will be necessary; one, two and a half, and another

ten miles, respectively, north of Columbus. These bridges will be quite large. There will also be a number of smaller ones required.
