

NEW MEXICO

Southwestern Wins From S. P. Railway.

With the completion of the Fairbanks Tucson extension of the El Paso and Southwestern railroad the Southern Pacific will be deprived of several thousands of dollars worth of business which it had formerly taken largely by compulsion. The Golden State limited which is now delivered to the Southern Pacific at El Paso will travel over the Southwestern and be delivered at Tucson, thus depriving the Southern Pacific of a 375 mile haul, at the same time shortening the distance of the through trains of the Rock Island 67 miles to the coast.

There is also further evidence that James J. Hill, the builder of the northwest has aligned himself with the Phelps Dodge interests against the Southern Pacific and that the Rock Island of which the Phelps Dodge interests have a large stock are looking forward to the purchase of the Spreckles line which is being built from San Diego to Yuma, Arizona.

All this means that Columbus will soon be located on one of the greatest transcontinental routes in America, which will put it before the public eye in a very prominent manner.
