Attorney Neill B. Field of this city yesterday filed a motion for a rehearing in the territorial supreme court in the cases of Thomas S. Hubbell vs. Perfecto Armijo and Frank A. Hubbell vs. Justo R. Armijo, which were decided at the two days' special session last week in favor of the Hubbells. The motion for re-hearing will be argued at the regular session of the territorial supreme court, which will convene on the afternoon of Jan. Perfecto Armijo and Justo R. Armijo are the present sheriff and treasurer respectively of Bernalillo county, having been appointed at the time Governor Otero removed from soffice Sheriff Thomas S. Hubbell and Treasurer Frank A.
