ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF CIMARRON PUBLISHING COMPANY
Know all men by these presents, that we the undersigned, each and all citizens of the United States of America, in order to form a corporation under and in accord with the laws of the Territory of New Mexico, for ourselves, our associates and our assigns, do hereby certify and declare as follows, to-wit:

1st. That the name of this corporation is and shall be the "CIMARRON PUBLISHING COMPANY."

2. The location of the principal office of the corporation is in the Village of Cimarron, in the County of Colfax and Territory of New Mexico, and the agent for service of process is James McVey.

3. The object for which the corporation is formed are as follows, to-wit; to engage in business as proprietors and publishers of newspapers, journals and magazines, to acquire, print, publish, conduct, or otherwise deal in any newspaper, magazine, book or other publication to carry on the business of newspaper and magazine proprietors and publishers; to carry on the business of job printers, lithographers, electrotypers, engravers, and advertising agents; to buy, sell, exchange and generally deal in real properties, improved and unimproved, office buildings, store buildings, dwelling houses, barns, water rights, and privileges; to build, construct, operate, maintain, lease, sell and incumber buildings of all kinds and descriptions; to maintain a general real estate agency and brokers business, including the right to make and maintain loans upon real estate, improved or otherwise, and to supervise, manage and protect such property and loans and all interest or claims affecting the same; to have the same insured against fire and other casualties; to investigate, the credit, financial solvency and sufficiency of borrowers, mortgagors and sureties upon bonds, mortgages and undertakings; to improve, manage, operate and sell mortgage, lease or otherwise dispose of any property, real or personal, and take mortgages and assignments of mortgages thereon; to borrow money for its purposes, to

issue and dispose of its negotiable bonds and obligations therefor, and to mortgage and pledge its property to secure the payment thereof; and generally do whatever may be necessary or proper to carry on its business, in all of its branches.
4.
