Washington, D. C., June 12—President Taft today granted an unconditional pardon to Lorenzo D. Barnes, an inmate of the Government Insane Hospital, who had overheard a plot among the inmates of the home who were arranging a general delivery, which plot he revealed to the officers, thus preventing a general break for liberty.

Attorney General Wickersham recommended the pardon, saying that while Barnes had slain a single man at one time, he had now retrieved himself by saving the lives of many. Barnes had been sent to the Hospital suffering from insanity, but has been cured. While out of his mind, he had committed murder, but this has been wiped off the slate.
