RESTORATION TO ENTRY OF LANDS IN NATIONAL FOREST.
 Notice is hereby given that the lands described below, embracing 80 acres, within the Lincoln National Forest, New Mexico, will be subject to settlement and entry under the provisions of the homestead laws of the United States and the act of June 11, 1906 (34 Stat., 223), at the United States land office at Roswell, New Mexico on August 25, 1911. Any settler who was actually and in good faith claiming any of said lands for agricultural purposes prior to January 1, 1906, and has not abandoned same, has a preference right to make a homestead entry for the lands actually occupied.
