Nicholson, and is accompanied by Ford Harvey, chief of the Harco mining system, and several other officials.

Mr. Fisher's trip to Hutchinson is for the purpose of presenting to the president a report on the Harco mining system, and also to discuss the proposed reclamation of the Colorado river. Mr. Fisher is expected to remain in Hutchinson for several days.

Mr. Fisher's visit to Albuquerque is the first since he became secretary of the interior. He is expected to visit other parts of the state during his trip.
