THE TAXATION SYSTEM. The importance of wise and just legislation in regard to the taxation system of the state of New Mexico is becoming more and more generally

recognized throughout the state and the following from the Honorary Chairman is a fair sample of the comment that is being heard:

"It is doubtful whether any member of the state legislature could possibly render the state a more valuable service than by securing the passage of a law properly regulating the assessment of property for purposes of taxation. It is a generally recognized fact that the total assessed valuation of property in the state should be at least five times as large as it is, and also that the present unjust and harmful state of affairs in that regard is due to the undervaluation of most property and the escape of the rest from paying any taxes at all. The burden of taxation is thus unequally distributed, and that is a rank injustice. The rate of taxation is inordinately high, and that is a great evil, for it results in keeping capital out of the state in spite of all the explanations that can be offered. All this is a deplorable state of affairs. Who is the legislator that will undertake to apply a wise remedy?"

STATE WILLING TO SEND 40 CONVICTS FOR ROAD WORK

Penitentiary Inmates to Be Sent to Bernalillo County Provided County Will Feed Them During Stay Here.

That the state is willing to loan forty convicts to Bernalillo county to be used in road work for an indefinite length of time provided Bernalillo county will pay for their subsistence during the time they are engaged in such work, is the encouraging report brought back to Albuquerque by Attorney A. B. Stroup, who returned last night from Santa Fe, where he attended a meeting of the state road commissioners. Mr. Stroup says that it is now squarely up to the board of county commissioners of this county to accept or reject the offer.

ROAD CLEARED BY USE OF DYNAMITE

Enterprising Citizens Blow Immense Boulder Out of Entrance to Bear Canyon With Giant Powder.

As a result of the enterprise of a number of Albuquerque citizens, a considerable service has been rendered the pleasure seekers of Albuquerque who frequent the wilds of Bear Canyon in the Sandia in the summer season. Yesterday a party of good road boosters who believe in works as well as faith went out to the canyon and by the liberal use of dynamite removed from the mouth of the canyon a huge boulder which has made it almost impossible for vehicles to get into the canyon. The party consisted of John W. Fredericks, Gustave Arthur and Henry Westerfeld and Frank Quinn, the latter New Mexico representative for the Dupont Powder company. The dynamiters had no drills and after trying several times to blow up the boulder with the government force of the giant powder with "mudcaps" they took twelve pounds of the explosive and put it clear under the rock, blowing it fifteen feet up the hillside.
