ARTESIA MEN HAVE DISCOVERED RICH COPPER MINE

Homesteaders on Plains East of Eddy County Town Said to Have Struck a Bonanza.

Artesia, N. M., March 19.—Several years ago two brothers, J. B. and J. P. Neatherlin, came southwest and homesteaded two pieces of land, 160 acres, adjoining, and which was 12 miles east of Artesia. They prospected, and then left for the mine fields of Colorado to learn about precious ores, but said nothing of their intentions.

It is now known that these brothers knew they had a valuable copper vein under their homestead, and after proving up let it lay for five years so that the government could not take it away from them after they found the mineral.

The brothers recently returned and developed their mine. Recently they dug out eight tons of ore and shipped it to the smelter at Denver which actually brought them \$30.46 gross, or \$18.48 net, the freight amounting to \$12. In the ore mined was \$4.00 worth of silver and some very rich gold, though no report has been received on the gold.

The Santa Fe railroad has so much confidence in the mine that they are going to build a spur to it.

In the mine it is said, there are five or six different kinds of ores. The boys say there is nothing for sale except the ores.

It might also be said that there is no land subject to homestead ground in that section, too.

The boys have organized a company called the Artesia Copper Mining company, and have filed incorporation papers with the state corporation commission. Its office is at Artesia, Eddy county, and its statutory agent is W. I. Wyman. The company is incorporated at \$250,000, divided into 250,000 shares at \$1.00 each. It begins with a capital of \$3,000. The incorporators are: J. B. and J. P. Neatherlin, P. O. Leaman, George Lewis, W. I. Wyman and M. H. Young, all of Artesia, and each taking 500 shares.

ELABORATE PLANS FOR GOVERNOR OF NEW MEXICO

Douglas is Going to Spread Itself When McDonald Visits Arizona Next Month.

Douglas, Ariz., March 19.—At the regular meeting of the chamber of commerce and mines last night it was decided to arrange for a number of automobiles to convey Governor Hunt and his party, including the several county officials, to Rio Rico, where, after luncheon, the west-bound train, which arrives at that point at 1:55, will be met by the official party to convey Governor McDonald and his staff to Douglas, arriving here in time for the informal dinner to be tendered the official guests by the chamber of commerce.

In the evening at the Hotel Goodwin a musical program will be rendered to which the public will be invited. During the intermissions on the program short addresses will be delivered by the various officials, the opening address to be made by Mayor M. C. Hankins.

It promises to be a gala day in the history of Douglas, and a general mingling of the official guests and citizens will be one of the features of the evening.

The morning of the 16th will be given over entirely to sightseeing, such as visits to the smelters, the Country club, Agua Prieta, etc. and it is very likely that a trip will be made to Tombstone canyon to inspect the work already accomplished on the state highway.

SOUTHWESTERN MAY BE HEADED TO COAST

Announcement of Construction to Phoenix Headed by James Douglass Basis for the Rumor.

Phoenix, Ariz., March 19.—Articles of incorporation of the Tucson & Phoenix Tidewater railroad were filed here today with the state corporation commission. The terminals of the railroad are to be Phoenix and San Diego. James Douglass, of Douglas, of the Phoenix-Dodge interests, has \$125,000 of the stock in his name.

The filing of the articles of incorporation is believed to foreshadow beyond a doubt the extension of the El Paso & Southwestern railroad to the Pacific coast, first from Tucson to Phoenix and thence to San Diego, with the prospect of completion in time for the transcontinental traffic caused by the two expositions in California next year.



The Right Way to Roll a Cigarette



I. In fingers of left hand, hold cigarette paper curved, so as to receive the tobacco. Four right quantity of "Bull" Durham cut of muslin sack with right hand, stroving tobacco evenly in paper.



III. And roll the cigarette on the lower fingers, so that the index fingers move up and the thumbs move down. With the thumbs, gently but firmly force the edge of the paper over the tobacco, and




IV. Shape the cigarette by rolling it with the thumbs, as you draw them apart.



V. Hold the cigarette in your right hand, and



VI. Moisten the projecting edge of the paper.



VII. With fingers close ends of cigarette by twisting the paper, and you have a cigarette properly made, properly shaped and ready to smoke.

GOVERNMENT WILL MAKE GREAT SHOW AT FRISCO

Federal Display will be Distributed Through All of the Larger Exposition Buildings

The United States government is preparing a series of elaborate exhibits for the Panama-Pacific International exposition, which will be far more comprehensive than any display ever made by it before and will present a complete record of the activities of the government in behalf of the people during the last decade. The exhibits will be distributed among all of the various exhibit palaces and will show every phase of the government's activities.

A feature of a sight-seeing trip through Washington, D. C., always is a visit to the United States treasury, where the actual making of paper notes and coin is shown. A representation of this part of the treasury will be brought to San Francisco and visitors to the exposition will be enabled to witness the actual manufacture of United States coin in one of the exhibit palaces. The machinery (1914)

turns out millions of dollars a day will be taken direct from one of the United States mints to the exposition and every detail of the mintage displayed.

Few realize just what the United States fish commission is doing for the American people, and the government is now preparing the construction of an aquarium and, in connection with it, the hatchery in which the various stages of development from the spawn to the full-sized fish will be shown.

It is the fish commission that keeps the streams and lakes stocked with the edible fishes and by scientific breeding prevents the extinction of species. The spawn are hatched in numbers running into the billions, yet despite the remarkable care with which they are handled, only a small portion of these ever attain maturity. Large cans of the eggs and the hatched fish are transported from the hatcheries to the streams and must be fed with air every few moments. This

requires constant care and exceptional knowledge. The visitor to this particular exhibit will be taken through various departments and shown the hatching of the eggs, the means of transportation and finally, the immense aquarium now being constructed.

For many years the privilege of witnessing actual practice with the big disappearing coast defense guns has been greatly limited and only acquaintance with army men or inducement in Washington could gain the desired permission.

The government now has consented to permit the visitors to the exposition to have free access to forts adjoining the exposition grounds.

Daily practice on the big guns with sub-caliber charges will be held, and weekly target practice with full charges. Each time one of these guns is fired with a full charge the cost to the government amounts to several hundred dollars. In addition to this unusual feature the several regiments of soldiers stationed at the Presidio, the largest army post of the west, will maneuver and hold daily drills and exercises and may even compete with detachments of troops from foreign nations attending the international military tournament.

In the palace of transportation a postal car will be shown in its entirety with the postal clerks actually operating a railway mail car. There will also be on the grounds a small post office where letters may be mailed. Every detail of the operation of checking, handling and transmitting mail may be seen here.

On the sea-front of the exposition site there will be maintained and operated a United States government life

saving station, fully equipped, where exhibition drills will be held daily.

The navy department's exhibit will be of exceptional interest. The actual work done in battleships will be displayed and explained in detail by the officers in charge, and the education of the enlisted men will be shown.

The bureau of standards is one of the least known departments of the government, yet its work is without question highly important. It is this department that fixes the standards of weights and measures and millions of dollars are expended to prevent the slightest deviation from the fixed standard. The bar representing one foot in length is composed of two metals joined together in a most ingenious manner and the extremes of temperature will not cause this standard to expand or contract one-millionth part of one inch.

A special laboratory is being constructed by the heads of the department and the various scientific aids requisite to the proper maintenance of the standards will be shown.

Advisory committees will have been appointed by the bureau of mines and the geological survey and their exhibits will be of intensely interesting to the technical students as well as the general public.

To avoid the duplication of exhibits by various educational institutions the government is preparing a unified educational exhibit that will show the progress of the country in education during the last decade.

Special attention will be paid to the Panama canal. The construction of which the exposition is to celebrate, and a five-hundred-ton model of the canal will be shown. It is said by government experts that a person may gain a great deal better idea of the canal by a visit to this exhibit than could be obtained by actually passing through the canal. The system of hygiene practiced in the canal will receive special attention in the national public health display. It was the scientific work of Dr. Gorgas that made possible the construction of the Panama canal.
