STIFF SENTENCES FOR NEW YORK KIDNAPPERS

Leaders of Band Who Held Frank Longo for 49 Days Get Fifty Years Each in Sing Sing.

New York, Aug. 12.—The maximum sentence of from 25 to 50 years in Sing Sing was today imposed on Pasquale Milano, leader of the band that kidnaped eight-year-old Frank Longo from his home on the east side and held him captive for 49 days. Francesco Malacuso, another member of the band, was sentenced to from 12 to 25 years in Sing Sing, while a third member, Vincenzo Acena was given from 20 to 30 years.

Six more alleged members of the band are in the Tombs awaiting trial. According to the evidence produced at the trial the kidnapers of the Longo boy threatened to dismember his body and shoot his parents unless money was forthcoming for his return. Several hundred dollars in marked money was given to the leaders by the boy's father. After his release Frank led the police to the place where he had been held and pointed out his captors.
