HOPEWELL AND HIS NEIGHBORS MAKE BIG SHIPMENT

Thirty-five Cars of Black Range Cattle Moved From Engle Yesterday to Denver and Lamar.

Colonel W. S. Hopewell of this city and his neighbor, both of whom own the Black Range stock company, yesterday shipped thirty-five cars of cattle from Engle to the purchasers at Denver and Lamar, Colo. The purchase was made by George A. Dudd, a well known trader, who bought largely on his own account. It is understood, in addition to Colonel Hopewell, who was the heaviest shipper, the movement included sales to James Brothers, R. F. Penkey, Calhoun and Miller, George and William Whitman, Cliff Crews and a number of others whose list were small.

Charles Graham and sons also shipped from Engle yesterday 250 head of cows and calves. Mr. Dudd being the purchaser.

A shipment of an car of calves will leave Engle Saturday, the 20th for Kansas where they are to go in winter feed. The sellers are Moore and Doolittle.

BOX CAR CARRIES MOHAWK WORTH \$50,000 TO MARKET

The Silver City Independent of Tuesday says: Seventy-eight thousand pounds of mohawk wool to fill one full-sized box car was shipped from Tyrone on October 12. This represented the full crop of seven seasons' growth in the immediate vicinity of Tyrone and indicates a total crop value for the year of something in the neighborhood of \$1,000,000. The approximate value of the shipment only can be stated as about \$200,000. It is not until the wool is packed in bales and shipped through the hands of export agents in New York that the wool's value is made on a basis of an average price of 24-25 cents per pound. With the wool in Tyrone likely to cut off the entire supply from that part of the country, the price of wool in the market is likely to be raised to a point where the sheep raisers in the past few years are expected. The greatest wool producing country of the world is South Africa and the supply from this source will not be affected by the war.

The shipment sent out from Tyrone went to the National Mohawk Growers' association, with headquarters in Boston, Mass. via Baltimore. This association is a combination of wool-growers who supply the bulk of the wool used in the manufacture of the various types of goods made in the past few years are expected. CHAIRMAN OF TAX COMMISSION ON ITS CRITICS

John W. Poe Issues Brief but Pointed Statement Regarding Attacks by Republican Newspapers.

Chairman John W. Poe of the state tax commission, which is now in session in Santa Fe, has given out a statement concerning a series of more or less vicious attacks on the commission and its work under the Bureau tax law, which have been made by Republican newspapers, in which he calls attention to the facts in connection with the work of the commission and the conditions under which it has been carried on.

Mr. Poe's statement is published in the Santa Fe New Mexican of Wednesday evening as follows: "The state tax commission has worked hard in an honest and painstaking effort to render a maximum of service to the state. In increasing assessments and adding property to the rolls it was inevitable, in view of the limited time for gathering information and the limited means at the disposal of the commission, that some taxpayers should suffer. This is very regrettable, but for the actions taken the commission has no apologies to make. It feels that it has done the very best possible under the circumstances."

"The state tax commission is wholly and solely responsible for any actions taken," Mr. Poe said, "as secretary simply carries out the orders of the commission. His responsibility ends there. In this connection I wish to say that the commission has found Mr. Earnest particularly competent in the performance of his duties, and we have only praise for the manner in which he has conducted the office. Personally I regard an attempt to whip any individual over the shoulder of his commission as the rankiest kind of cowardice."

"In its work," continued Mr. Poe, "the state tax commission was confronted by a condition, not a theory. We had a law that levied the taxes, and in order to bring about a condition of sufficient revenue for state and county purposes it was necessary to increase the total valuation of the state. There were but two ways of accomplishing this—by raising assessments and by placing additional property on the tax rolls. The time for securing detailed information was limited and the need of action was imperative. And in the matter of assessment increases I want to say that had not the commission, on its own initiative, taken advantage of the concluding paragraph of Article 6 of the constitution, giving it authority to amend or modify any order made by it upon a proper showing within thirty days, horizontal raises on every dollar's worth of property in every county would have been the result, and the injustice to taxpayers would have been great. By taking advantage of this provision the commission enabled itself to raise only such percentages as it honestly believed, from all information at hand, should be raised."

"The commission has made no attempt to carry out that section of the constitution providing for the division of the state into five districts, and for suits to each district by the commissioners assigned to them. For the reason that it can see no adequate return to the state from the expense entailed. The law fails to give any commissioner having evidence in any district authority to make a decision, all that he can do is to file testimony and report the same to the full commission. The result at our disposal are not sufficient for each district to give any definite promise of benefit of some value."

"In conclusion," said President Poe, "I feel that it may not be amiss to call attention to the fact that it is barely possible the tax commission, which has been studying the Bureau tax law and working under its provisions since its passage, knows a little more about it than the men now engaged in criticizing its actions."

NO VERDICT RESULT IN BACA TRIAL AT LAS VEGAS

East Las Vegas, N. M., Nov. 17.—Following the disagreement of the trial jury in the case of the State vs. Tranquillo Baca, charged with cattle stealing, and the report of the grand jury, Judge Leahy has tonight discharged both juries for the term, thus practically ending criminal business for the term. The grand jury returned twelve true bills, and four no bills, the disposition of those cases arranged being as follows:

Marcosito Britado pleaded guilty to stealing horses from Fidel Ortiz, and was sentenced to eighteen months in the penitentiary and fined \$500.

Edufraco Buzos pleaded guilty to the charge of stealing horses and was given not less than one year and not more than eighteen months in the penitentiary and to pay a fine of \$500.

Jose Lujan pleaded guilty to stealing cows and was sentenced for not less than one year and not more than eighteen months and fined \$500.

Jose Castillo pleaded not guilty to the charge of rape. He asked the court to appoint counsel, which was done. Leo M. Tipton and Luis E. Arango were named. Castillo is accused of raping his own daughter.

Zoevario Valdes, a well known special policeman, pleaded not guilty to the charge of assault with a deadly weapon on Willie L. H. aged 14. He was released on a bond of \$1,200. Trial was set for the next term of court.

Edufraco Buzos and Enrique Montoya pleaded not guilty to the charge of assault upon with intent to kill Juan Salazar. By request of the two men, Luis E. Arango was appointed by the court to defend them. Their trial was set for the next term of court.

Francisco Trevino pleaded not guilty to the charge of stealing horses, and trial set for the next term of court.

Carlos Vial pleaded not guilty to the charge of wife abandonment and trial was set for the next term of court.

Jose Lujan pleaded guilty to the charge of stealing cattle from Jose O. Rivera and was sentenced for one year and fined \$500.

CHOSE PEST HOUSE AS SCENE FOR SUICIDE

Silver City Brakeman, Weary of Life, Locks Himself In and Sends Bullet From a .45 Colt's Through His Head.

A dispatch from Santa Fe to the Silver City Independent tells of an unusual suicide at the big copper camp when T. Sterling, 32, a former switchman here, committed suicide by shooting himself through the head with a revolver.

Sterling had been yesterday night and was relieved about a week ago for failing to show up for duty.

Just after the dinner hour Sunday a nurse at the Ohio hospital saw a man enter the pest house, which is on the hill back of the hospital. She informed one of the doctors. As an emergency business there at that time the doctor proceeded to investigate and found the door locked. On demanding that it be opened, a voice inside called to know who was there.

On being informed it was the doctor, it replied to know which doctor. Another demand by the doctor to open the door was responded to by a shuffling of feet, but the door was not opened.

Deputy Sheriff Pentwood was then called and the door forced open. Sterling was found lying on the bed, shot through the head. A .45-Colt's revolver was clutched in the right hand.

A coroner's jury was called and returned a verdict of suicide. Papers and effects on the person of the deceased showed him to be an ex-soldier, he having been a member of the 102d of more than in Iowa and Texas.

A telegram addressed to his son at Yorktown, Tex., read: "In trouble, need money. Send it now or never."

Also a note addressed to some publisher in Texas, explained that he had been discharged before, and as he then had a family, he stood for it, but as he now had no family, he would stand for dismissal. That he had wasted his life in trying to help the working man, that he was doing this to get a president.

RUMORED END TO BOUNDARY SUIT WITH TEXAS PROVES ERROR

Austin, Tex., Nov. 18.—No settlement has been reached in the Texas-New Mexico boundary suit, which litigation is now pending in the United States supreme court, according to state officials here, despite a report which gained circulation to the contrary. This litigation instituted over a year ago by the state of New Mexico is an attempt to recover about 15,000 acres of fertile land situated a few miles above the city of El Paso on the Rio Grande river, which New Mexico is claiming because of a change in the course of the river.

In 1851, long before the present suit was instituted, there was settled a controversy between Texas and New Mexico as to the boundary of certain territory between Texas and that state. A survey of the disputed territory was made in 1851, known as the "Crocket-Swift survey," a complete report on this survey having been filed in the general land office, and given publicity at the time. The present suit is an entirely different matter and testimony is yet to be taken before the case is finally submitted to the United States supreme court.

AMERICAN BUILT SHIPS MAY GO INTO BATTLE

Ex-United States Naval Vessels Likely to Figure Prominently in Sea Conflict in Balkans.

Paris, Oct. 26.—American built ships and American big guns will figure in the first line of any naval operations growing out of the Balkan conflict, as the former American battleships Idaho and Mississippi, now the Greek battleships Kilkis and Lemnos, are the best warships possessed by any of the Balkan states.

The Balkans have a long stretch of coast on the Mediterranean and Black seas, making naval operations likely on both these fronts. All the states have navies, except Serbia. The Greeks had ordered a monster super-dreadnought of 23,000 tons, but this is cancelled. They also had the Salamis, 19,000 tons, building in Vulcan yards of Germany, which the Germans quickly appropriated. This leaves them with the former Idaho and Mississippi in the first line, the Avronoff of 16,000 tons, three 5,000-ton cruisers, 12 gunboats and a fair-sized flotilla of destroyers and torpedo boats, including two submarines. One of the best Greek submarines was built in France, and was taken over by Greece only two weeks ago because Greece was behind on payments.

Bulgaria has a Mediterranean and Black sea front. But her navy is insignificant, consisting of the gunboat Nadjida of 700 tons, six torpedo gunboats, and four small craft, including King Ferdinand's royal yacht, the Krom, which is strongly armed, should Russia bombard Varna. Bulgaria's Black sea port, as has been threatened, Bulgaria could make little naval resistance beyond that from shore batteries.

Rumania is entirely confined to the Black sea, where her navy consists of five coast defense monitors with 10-inch guns, the cruiser Elizabeth and a fleet of small gunboats.

The eight monster 14-inch rifles—among the largest ever produced—were under way at the Bethlehem works to be mounted on the Greek battleship Salamis building at the Vulcan yard in Germany. But when Germany appropriated the Greek battleship the huge guns had not been delivered and Germany prepared her own type of Krupp guns. Just then Greece was much interested in the approach of the Anglo-French force sent to the Dardanelles. Just across the Aegean from Greece, and a transfer was quickly arranged by which the 14-inch guns were mounted on monitors forming a part of the Dardanelles expedition. There they are today, probably the most effective weapons in use.
