### TEX ACTORS IN "KISS OF HATE" WEIGH TON

When "The Kiss of Hate" was produced recently, with Ethel Barrymore in the leading role, Director William Nigh had considerable difficulty in obtaining a suitable cast. The story which was written by Monte Cronin deals with Russian life and aims with intrigue and romance. Among the problems that confronted Mr. Nigh was to obtain actors of great physique, and types of unusual virility and cast of features. Director Nigh, himself, weighs just 115 pounds. The first ten men engaged averaged exactly one ton in weight, or an average of 200 pounds each. One of the parts in the cast was that of "Golgoth," a giant, who figures as the protector of the heroine in the still Siberian wastes. Mr. Nigh was fortunate in engaging Roy Applegate for this role. Mr. Applegate, who weighs 270 pounds and stands six feet four inches in height, is one of the few

men in the profession who can really act.

Mr. Applegate played an important role in the stellar cast of "The Tenth Commandment" for the World Film Company, and has been featured with William Courtleigh in "Lives of the Cowards," Florence Reed in "The Cowardly Way," Kathryn Gasterman in "The Hired Girl," Muriel Carter in "Daughter of the Sea," Renee Kelly in "All for a Girl," and many other notable productions.

In "The Kiss of Hate" Mr. Applegate is given ample opportunities to display his strength and prowess, and has several sensational and realistic fights with other big men in the cast.

### GAUMONT TO UTILIZE OFFICIAL FEDERAL FILMS

The unusual interest created by the recent series of the Gaumont company, "See America First," has been heightened by the further announcement that among these pictures will

be many taken by the United States department of the interior. The photography is exceptional, having been done for the government by H. T. Cowling. Mr. Cowling has filmed national parks, forest reserves, reclamation projects and many industries whose raw products are dependent upon conservation by the department of the interior.

"These motion pictures were taken by the department of the interior, under whose permission they are now exhibited by the Gaumont company." It is not the intention of the Gaumont company to release these pictures in consecutive order. To give the series variety, there will be interspersed pictures of scenic interest just as are at present shown.

Mr. Cowling has traveled wherever the department of the interior has had supervision throughout the United States. His film serves as a record for the department. Acting for the

Gaumont company, C. M. White has had screened the results of Mr. Cowling's activities with a camera. Those which make a popular appeal have been selected by him for "See America First."

"I have seen practically all the motion pictures used by lecturers upon the United States," said Mr. White in describing the features he had selected from the government, "and I can frankly say that I have never seen any photography surpass the work of Mr. Cowling. Not only are his light effects exceptional, but he has exercised the news instinct of a magazine writer and filmed his subjects in a manner that brings out their strong and interesting characteristics to the best advantage."

As for shoes, she has more than a hundred and thirty pairs to choose from, ranging all the way from black, white and tan shoes for street wear, through sport boots and dancing slippers with diamond buckles, to footgear of wonderful Persian material that cost more than \$100 per pair.

In "Gloria's Romance," in which Miss Burke portrays the role of a

wealthy society girl, a \$12,000 Russian sable coat will be seen, together with a \$12,000 ermine coat, a \$9,000 chinchilla coat, a blue and gold and metal embroidered evening coat trimmed with lace that was priced at \$150 per yard. Lingerie enough to supply five average bridal trousseaus has been provided for Miss Burke, and in one chapter of the motion picture novel she will be seen in a "nightie" costing exactly \$75, though you get but a glimpse of her in it, since she immediately tosses over her pretty shoulders a lace negligee

\$275. This negligee is of brilliant peacock blue, embroidered with gold and trimmed in orchid satin—a bit of feminine wear that will delight every woman who beholds it on the screen.
