RUSSIANS KEEP ON POUNDING TEUTONS AND MENACE LONG FRONT ON STRIPA

Heavy Fighting Continues on Western Front, French Reporting Germans Entirely Unsuccessful in Counter-attacks.

ARTILLERY ACTIVE ON FRONT ALONG SOMME

British Say Turks Were Crushingly Defeated East of Suez, Losing Fourth of Effectives in Army of 14,000.

By Evening Herald (Special Wire) General D'Amboise is presenting the official report of the Russian army in northern Russia where the Russian forces are being steadily forced to the south of the front.

The forward push of the Russians in this sector is not only bringing them closer to Leningrad on the direct line of advance, but is pointed out by military critics as being extremely dangerous to the entire Russian front along the Stripa, to the south, which is rapidly being outflanked.

Heavy fighting continues on the western front in the Verdun region. According to Paris, however, the Germans have been entirely unsuccessful in their offensive to regain ground lost to the French in General Nivelle's vigorous offensive of last week.

In the field of the allied offensive along the Somme today, Paris' official reports only attribute activity, which, however, was intense in the region of Champan north of the front.

British reports of the fighting east of the Suez canal in Egypt show a crushing defeat for the Turks, who are said to have lost one-fourth of their effectives which numbered some 14,000 men.

RUSSIANS ANNOUNCE MORE SUCCESS SOUTH OF TRODY. Perterograd, Aug. 7. (Via London, 4:14 p. m.)—Further successes for the Russians along the Stripa and Grahberka rivers in northern Russia south of Trody were announced in the war office today.

GERMANS RECAPTURE PART OF TRENCHES IN SOMME. Berlin, Aug. 7. (Via London, 4:14 p. m.)—German troops have recaptured portions of the trench which had been taken by the British near Fromery on the Somme front. It was officially announced today by the German army headquarters.

FRENCH REPORT REPULSE OF ATTACKS AT VERDUN. Paris, Aug. 7. (Special Wire)—The repulse of German attacks at Verdun and in the West and Thiepval woods in the Verdun sector is announced in the official statement issued by the French war office this afternoon.

BRITISH VICTORY OVER TURKS IS OVERWHELMING. London, Aug. 7.—The recent attempt of the Turkish to reach the Suez canal has proven a greater failure than the earlier reports indicated.

Additional evidence that Dorr was planning a desperate deed, the police say, is found in a recent story of his to a Colorado newspaper of the fact that he had a mustache, wigs and long whiskers which he had planned to use in his scheme.
