LABOR WILL SUFFER WHEN WAR IS OVER, DECLARES HUGHES

When the Men Now in European Trenches Are Withdrawn to Follow Pursuits of Peace, Reaction Will Come in U. S.

The Evening Herald Special Writer Hartford, Conn., Oct. 26.—Charles E. Hughes went into what he termed "the home stretch of the campaign" with the opening speech here today of his last trip before election day. The nominee, in a theater, spoke before an audience composed partly of workers in munition plants nearby.

"This is no time for complacency," he said. "This is not time for political talk about prosperity. It is a time for thought. When the men now in the trenches of Europe are withdrawn to follow the pursuits of peace, the abnormal stimulus of the war will be withdrawn and the men in this country now engaged in satisfying the demands of Europe at war no longer will have that demand to satisfy."

"It is a new Europe we will have to meet, a disunited, organized Europe, and we should not meet with a new United States. And you can no more run this country in the coming years on the tariff principle of our opponents than you can fly to the moon."

Mr. Hughes also spoke for the maintenance of American rights. "It is not the advantage of the administration's policy to way. A vote for me is a vote for maintaining our lasting peace and security by our self respect and the confidence and friendship of all nations."

Enroute to Hartford, Mr. Hughes was greeted by station crowds at New Haven and Meriden. Several hundred Yale students cheered him at New Haven.

House of Deputies Votes in Favor of Suffragan Bishops

The House of Deputies of the Protestant Episcopal general convention today adopted the amendment to the constitution authorizing provisional synods to elect suffragan bishops for any diocese in the province to have authority over any particular race.

The amendment, if it is adopted by the house of bishops and approved by the next general convention, will be a solution for the present of the problem of racial episcopate, which has been urged particularly because of the negro parishes in the church. The suffragan bishop would be under the direction of the diocesan bishop.

The house of deputies today concurred in the election of Rev. Frank Tourner as missionary bishop of western Canada and of Rev. Hain I. Harrison as missionary bishop of South Dakota.

Sinking Fund to be Created by the City; Council Fixes a Levy

In June, 1916, the district attorney of San Miguel county filed an application for an order in district court to force Jones to show cause why he had not paid the taxes assessed against his grant in San Miguel county. The same proceeding was brought in Guadalupe county to collect on the portion of the property in that county. There were included in the order taxes due for the years 1905 to 1915 inclusive, those being the delinquencies furnished the district attorney by the county treasurer. Books back of 1905 are kept in an outside, un-secured vault, and about the only unpaid taxes on those books are the unpaid Jones taxes. Jones appeared in court in both counties and made a fight for a reduction. But the court made him pay up taxes due for the years named in the orders.

No assessment against Mr. Jones' grant can be traced back of 1847. But Andrius Aristieus Jones owes taxes to the counties of San Miguel and Guadalupe for the years 1887 to 1904 inclusive which total \$30,016.47.
