BARNES' SCHOOL HISTORIES.

We have before us two school histories of the United States. One is designated "Brief," the other "Primary."

The "brief" history, on page 275, in speaking of Lee's surrender, says: "Twenty-two thousand six hundred and thirty-three small arms were given up."

"Brief," page 259, says: "Immense supplies of provisions were captured." "Primary," page 204, says: "Capturing the few stores that were left."

But turn from Barnes vs. Barnes to a very short view of the case of Barnes vs. Truth.

Page 246 gives a description of the action on Lookout Mountain, and designates it as the "far-famed battle above the clouds."

Page 271. "There was no waiting for roads to dry nor for bridges to be built, but the troops swept on like a tornado."

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his skill, his fearlessness, his success &c., &c., have all been commended, but not one word has yet been said about what, to me, seems one of his most characteristic accomplishments, viz: his handwriting.

But what I want to call attention to, besides the editor's fearfully and wonderfully made handwriting, is the prominence that the study of English is now assuming, the awakening interest that is abroad in our mother tongue.
