The Conference will be called to order at noon on the 10th day of May, when the senior bishop of the Church, the venerable J. C. Keener, will read a Scripture lesson and offer prayer, and then formally open the proceedings.

The secretary will doubtless be the Rev. John S. Martin, D. D. of Baltimore, who succeeded Dr. Summers, and was elected at Richmond. No other candidates have been mentioned.

Bishop E. R. Hendrix, of Kansas City, is the junior bishop of the Church. He has taken the place of the lamented Bishop Marvin in the estimation of Missouri Methodists.

Governor Seay, of Alabama, heads the list of lay delegates from his State. Ex-Governor E. Jackson, of Maryland, is among the delegates from the Virginia Conference.
