WEATHER CROP BULLETIN.

Cotton Continues From
Two to Three Weeks
Late.

CORN AND TOBACCO SHOW
SOME Improvement.

Temperature Was Below the Average and Sunshine was Lacking, Affecting Crops Unfavorably.

For the week ending Friday, July 17th, 1891:

The reports of correspondents of the weekly weather crop bulletin issued by the North Carolina Experiment Station and State Weather Service for the week ending Friday, July 17th, 1891, show that the temperature has been decidedly below the normal during the week over the entire State, which has had an unfavorable effect on crops, especially cotton. The latter part of the week was warmer and more favorable. The amount of sunshine has been deficient.

The rainfall has been rather unevenly distributed, but generally favorable except in northern portions of eastern and southern portions of eastern and southern portions of central district. Cotton continues from two to three weeks late, and is blooming slowly. Condition one per cent. lower than reported for last week. Corn shows an improvement of one, to two per cent. The rains have started the grass to growing again, and it requires constant work to keep crops clean.

The present condition of crops in the State is as follows: Cotton, 74; corn, 83; tobacco, 84; wheat 81; oats, 76; grass, 88.

EASTERN DISTRICT.

Temperature below the average, causing cotton to shed in a few places. Latter part of week warmer and more favorable. Showers have been favorable except in northern portion of district. Crops in excellent condition in southern portion. Cotton continues from two to three weeks late. Present condition of crops: Cotton, 76; corn, 79; tobacco, 83; wheat, 88; oats, 77; grass, 89; potatoes, 82. (Forty-nine reports received, representing 21 counties.)

CENTRAL DISTRICT.

Generally favorable weather has prevailed in this district during the last week; although the temperature has been decidedly below the normal. Showers occurred everywhere during the week, cotton continues to improve but slowly and is not blooming very rapidly. Corn has improved 3 per cent. and tobacco 4 per cent. since last week. Present condition of crops in this district: Cotton, 74; corn, 82; tobacco, 84; wheat, 74; oats, 82; grass, 89; potatoes, 82. (40 reports representing 16 counties.)

WESTER DISTRICT.

Drought prevailed in some localities until relieved this week by copious showers. Temperature was below the average and had an unfavorable effect on cotton and tobacco have improved about three per cent. since last week. Cotton stationary. Present condition of crops in this district: Cotton, 72; corn, 87; tobacco, 86; wheat, 80; oats, 70; grass, 87; potatoes, 78. (60 reports received representing 25 counties.)

EXPLANATION.

Condition of crops stated on basis of 100. Best condition is 100; excellent condition is 90 to 100; good condition is 80 to 90; fair condition is 70 to 80; poor condition is under 70.
