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THEY WILL NOT VOTE IT.

The white men of Halifax county who were Democrats before they went to the Populists are not going to vote the fusion ticket next Tuesday.

After the election is over there will be practically only two political parties in North Carolina, the Democratic and Republican; and the white men who are going to be Democrats hereafter are not going to vote the county fusion ticket next Tuesday.

HERE'S YOUR CHOICE.

On next Tuesday every voter in the county will have the privilege of choosing for himself. And here is the choice: Shall E. T. Clark, Jim Arrington and Scott Harris represent the county in the next Legislature, or shall Claude Kitchin, Dr. R. A. Patterson and W. E. Thorne represent us? Shall the county's business be in the hands of experienced men and Democrats as commissioners, or shall it be turned over to the fusionists? Shall the other officers of the county be Democrats or fusionists? These questions are for voters to settle?

MR. KITCHIN AT RINGWOOD.

Has Made a Brilliant Campaign.

Mr. Claude Kitchin, Democratic nominee for the State Senate from this county, has made a brilliant campaign in this county; and wherever he has spoken he has most favorably impressed all who heard him.

A correspondent from Brinkleyville writes THE COMMONWEALTH in most complimentary terms of Mr. Kitchin's speech at Ringwood, but we now have space for only excerpts from the letter.

Our correspondent says: "I heard him at Ringwood and at Essex and I only wish every man in the county could have heard him. I do not think there was a Populist who heard him that did not think the Democrats are right, and that the Populist leaders in the State and county are trying to ram gold bugs down their throats, and the Populists as well as the Democrats are determined to vote against them. His arguments are so forcible and convincing that I cannot see how any honest silver man can do otherwise than vote the Democratic ticket."

"While Mr. Kitchin spoke some colored men said he was right and everybody should follow him."

"During his speech one man said, 'He's as good as his father.' Some said he is a chip of the old block, but another said, 'No, sir, he's no chip but a very large block.'"

Our correspondent says that Mr. Kitchin's speech was one that even Zeb Vance might have been proud to make, and adds that the wonder is that one so young as Mr. Kitchin should be so thoroughly posted on the political issues of the day. He makes pleasing predictions for Mr. Kitchin's future and says that North Carolina will be glad to honor him with positions of trust even higher than a seat in the State Senate.

Our correspondent says: "Fellow Democrats, and Populist friends, who shall represent us in our next General Assembly? Shall it be this young champion, Dr. Patterson and Mr. Thorne, or shall it be Mr. E. T. Clark and two gold bugs, Jim Arrington and Scotland Harris? Rally, friends, do justice to your wives and little ones and to your country."

Pleasant mention is made of Chairman Travis' vigorous fight in the county, and he predicts also a brilliant career for him because of his energy and pluck.

Congressman Woodard's speech, says our correspondent, was telling in its effect, and he thinks Mr. Woodard will be re-elected.

Vote the Democratic ticket next Tuesday and help save North Carolina and Halifax county. But if you vote the Republican ticket you will cast your ballot for the complete undoing of all our good government for twenty years. Which will you do?
