WILL BEGIN SUBMARINE WAR

Copenhagen, July 5, via London—Referring to the announced abandonment by Great Britain of the declaration of London, Capt. I. Persius, naval expert of the Berliner Tageblatt, declares in that newspaper that the German government purposes again to begin "a new and unrestricted submarine war" in order to force Great Britain to follow the rules of international law.

Captain Persius states that Germany has now such a large number of submarines that they will be able to harm British trade considerably and prevent munitions reaching France.

WILMINGTON CARMEN STRIKE

Wilmington, N. C., July 5.—Wilmington practically was without street car service yesterday because of a disagreement between the traction company and its conductors and motormen over certain changes in operation which the company intended to put into practice. The employees walked out yesterday. One car was operated on the city streets a few hours but this was discontinued at noon. No violence was threatened. The principal ground for disagreement, it was said, was the company's intention to dispense with the conductors on certain interurban lines.

"Saturday, N. A. Riddick, distributor for the Saxon automobile for eastern North Carolina, accompanied by B. S. Brown and H. M. Hilliard made the three hundred mile tour as was stated that he would make in the columns of this paper last week.

"Beginning at 4:15 o'clock on a wet misty day the trip was completed in 14 hours and in every town which was passed the motorists drove over practically every street at the lowest gait that the car was capable of making, thereby greatly reducing the mileage per gallon of gasoline.

"The roads which were quite bad was a great handicap, but at no time during the journey was the engine of the car stopped and gears were only changed but twice.

"The route of the motorists was from Scotland Neck to Tarboro, to Bethel, to Greenville, to Tarboro, to Rocky Mount, to Elm City, to Wilson, to Rocky Mount, to Battleboro, to Whitakers, to Enfield, to Enfield to Halifax, to Weldon, to Littleton, to Fosburg, to Roanoke Rapids, and back to Scotland Neck the route that they came.

"Mr. Riddick drove at all times, he never leaving the car and was still comparatively fresh when Scotland Neck was reached.

"The average miles per gallon was 21½, and this could have been made much more if the party had not driven through and around each town at a slow rate.
