TO CORRESPONDENTS

We look to the friends of the Ledger to keep us posted concerning events of public interest in any part of the county.

There are one or two criminal cases to be tried in the superior court within the next few weeks, and the Dispatch hopes that in the interests of justice and for the good of the community, the attorneys in the cases will try to get prisoners at the bar and not the sheriff of Amador county, as has been their custom for some years past.

We have been asked several times during the week to interpret the import of the above paragraph. Therefore doth our cotemporary rush in to tender its friendly mediation and advice between the prosecution and the defense in a pending criminal trial.

The lines above quoted must have reference to that case, and that only. What peculiar circumstances are connected with that case that called forth the above admonition from the editor? Why thus give vent to his misgivings regarding the conduct of the trial? What has created the impression that the prosecuting officers may possibly come in for a searching? How tender-footed our cotemporary has been so far in touching upon this case.

He has refrained from reporting the facts for fear of interfering with the course of justice. Such is the high-born excuse this patron of justice gives for withholding the news. In behalf of which side—the prosecution or the defense—he takes this remarkable position of suppressing his own business, he leaves his readers to imagine.

The Ledger, on the other hand, has traveled its customary path in relation to this case. It has published all the facts obtainable, without commenting thereon either for or against the prosecution or the defendant. We have allowed no flimsy sentimentalism to stand in our way in giving the public the benefit of news of a privileged character. We are in favor of every wrong-doer, every violator of the law, being punished, after a fair and impartial trial. The officials who pursue the even tenor of their way with this sole object in view need fear no adverse criticism either inside or outside the court room. Conscious of their own rectitude, they will court, rather than shun, the sunlight. The more their acts are ventilated the more complete will be their vindication. To them has been confided the magna charter of our rights and liberties, and while they tread the straight line of duty, intent only upon handing down their sacred trust unscathed to their successors, the shafts of malice, the attacks of political rancor, and above and beyond all, the bitter words that so often characterize a hotly contested criminal trial—the mere flotsam and jetsam of the court room—will leave them unscathed.

It is a matter of common talk that the information filed in the Macquarrie case is a unique document. It seems to us a radical departure from established precedent in criminal jurisprudence in Amador county. It not only charges the defendant with the commission of a felony in issuing a spurious check with intention to defraud, but it also charges him having been convicted of misdemeanor on two previous occasions. Never before, within our recollection, has a defendant before the superior court been required to enter three distinct and separate pleas of "not guilty," in order to place in issue all the allegations of a complaint. Citizens are inquiring what laudable purpose can be served by this treble-headed complaint? Is it to set the pace for future prosecutions in Amador county? Assuming that a man has transgressed the law on a minor point once, and has been punished therefor, is the fact to be held in everlasting remembrance against him? Is the satisfaction of the law's demands to afford no atonement? Must the sins of the past be hurled at him in the name of the sovereign people, as an aggravation of a misdemeanor of the present? Is this the spirit of American law, or the spirit of vengeance? Wherefore doth the goddess of justice, under whose sheltering wings we all enjoy the inestimable benefits of liberty, array herself in this strange garb?

THE PRINTING RATES.

The Ledger is well aware that 10 cents per name was charged for printing the great register of Amador county at the election held in 1900. The question at issue is, is that the rate that has been established by the board in accordance with law. The county government act requires that the supervisors shall annually fix the rate of advertising and job printing. Now in May, 1900, the May meeting being the usual time in this county for establishing the rates of county printing—we find the following entry upon the minutes of the board of supervisors:

It is moved, seconded and carried that the printing rates of the county of Amador, state of California, for the year 1900 be established the same as for the year 1899.

The rate for printing the great register in 1899 was 25 cents per name. At the October meeting of the same year we find the following entry upon the minutes of the board:

It is ordered by the board that the rate of printing the indexes of the great register of Amador county, California, be fixed at 10 cents per name for 600 copies of said indexes.

Index is simply another name for the printed great register in the abridged form required by law. There may be room for a quibble as to which is the legally adopted rate, and no harm can be done in placing the matter beyond dispute. But aside from this point we contend that 10 cents per name is more than a fair and just price for the work involved. There is not one third of the labor involved in the present great register that there was in the old; but the price has not been reduced in proportion to the reduction of labor. There are many other points that demand a thorough revision and definite establishment of the printing rates. A discussion that ensued some months ago before the supervisors showed plainly enough that the language used in fixing the rates is ambiguous, and differently construed by the parties concerned. There is no reason why this should be so. Beyond this, the price of some of the heaviest items of printing required at an election is not fixed at all. We are all aware that no rates that can be established will cover everything that may be required by the county; but there is no valid reason why articles known to be required at intervals of at least two years, and the cost of which runs up into the hundreds of dollars, should not have a definite and fixed price as the law contemplates.

IMPORTANT TO LAND CLAIMANTS. A change has been made in the law relating to the filing and proving up on timber, stone and desert land. Heretofore persons wanting to take up such lands were compelled to travel to the district land office in order to do so. This in many cases involved considerable expense, especially when the final proofs had to be made at the land office also. The costs involved in these trips, with witnesses, militated against the disposal of timber lands in this and adjoining counties. But the present congress has changed all this. Applications for timber lands, and in fact every description of land, can now be made before United States Commissioner or clerk, the same as homestead filings, and the proofs may also be taken before these officers. More than this, filings on land in adjoining counties, such as those in Alpine and across the line of El Dorado, may be made before the commissioner in Amador county, and vice versa, and final proofs on such outside land may also be taken before that officer. This will be a convenience and saving of expense to many settlers in neighboring counties. Those interested in the settlement of government land should bear this in mind, that all matters relating to the taking up or proving up on public land may be attended to within the county, without the expense of a trip to Sacramento.

School Apportionment.

Office of the Superintendent of Common Schools, Jackson, Amador county, Cal., May 26, 1902. To boards of school trustees: Ladies and gentlemen—I herewith report to you the third apportionment for the school year commencing July 1st, 1901, and ending June 30th, 1902. Upon May 19th, 1902, the auditor of Amador county reported to me that there had been \$4387.66 apportioned to the county school fund.

To this \$4387.66, I added \$132.73 which remained in the unapportioned county school fund—making a total of \$4520.39. Of this \$4520.39 I have apportioned \$3038—the amount necessary to make up the \$500 and the \$400 to the school districts entitled to said amounts. I have further apportioned \$1482.39—\$1272.15 on the average daily attendance of the school year 1900-1901, \$8038 + \$1272.15 = \$4310.15, total amount apportioned.

The balance unapportioned is \$210.24. There will be another State apportionment made about the middle of July next; but available only for the payment of teachers' salaries.

Trustees' orders for the payment of jobs must be presented to the superintendent of schools not later than June 30th, if it is desired that payment of said orders be made this school year.
