RECEIVED WITH CHEERS.
Admiral Dewey is Paid Market Attention As the Great Chicago Great Military Hero.
Chicago, May 1.—Aud the booming of cannon and the cheers of hundreds of people, Admiral George Dewey arrived in Chicago yesterday. For the next three days he will be the guest of this city and the program for his entertainment will take up nearly every moment of his time until his departure Thursday morning for Jacksonville, Ill.
Never in the history of the great Auditorium has there been within its walls a sight more beautiful than that revealed last night when the great ball given in honor of Admiral Dewey was at its height. There have been festive occasions without number in the great hall; dances for charity, balls in honor of illustrious citizens, famous speakers and distinguished foreigners, but last night was the first time that Chicago has had within her gates a guest as distinguished representative of the American navy, the first time she has been permitted to pay her tribute of honor and respect to the victor of Manila Bay, and she utilized the opportunity to the full. There was nothing wanting. It was a decisive success from what to last in all details, from the decorations on the walls to the reception proper, which was tendered to the admiral. Fully 2,000 people were present.

TAYLOR MAY GO ABROAD.
At Any Rate, Kentucky's Republican Governor Will Not See His Election Experience Has Embittered His Life.
Frankfort, Ky., April 30.—Gov. Taylor is home from Washington to answer any indictment against him. It is said in reliable republican circles that Gov. Taylor has been in circumstances accept the nomination for governor next fall. He is worn out physically and desires to get away from Frankfort. If the supreme court exercises jurisdiction and decides the Kentucky case in favor of Gov. Taylor, he will remain and perform the duties of the office, but if he refuses to take the matter under consideration, he will go to Kentucky politics. It is said he will apply for an appointment abroad, where for the next three or four years he may rest and regain his physical strength, where he may be with his family, and where their education may be carried on without any interruption. This is a statement coming from a republican source, and it can be accepted as probably true. Gov. Taylor has had a trying experience and one that has embittered his existence.

CROPS ALL RUINED.
Fields in Texas Have Left Desolation in Their Wake—Labor Problem a Serious One.
Austin, Tex., May 1.—Heavy rains fell in many localities of central and southwest Texas again today and night, and the flood situation is growing more instead of improving. No reliable estimate can be made at this time of the damage done to growing crops. There is every indication that the flooded area of the Brazos and Colorado river valleys will encompass an area of an inundation of last year, when it was reliably estimated the losses aggregated \$6,000,000. No additional damage can be done now, for the crops in the bottoms are already ruined and the cotton will have to be replanted. The labor problem is the hard one now. The negroes are leaving the bottoms, and there is no one to take their place.

ROOT HINTS AT WAR.
Secretary of War Says Time is Near When We Must Give Up Monroe Doctrine, or Fight for It.
New York, May 1.—While the banquet given at Waldorf-Astoria was ringing with applause in honor of the hero of Appomattox, Elihu Root, with all the impressiveness attaching to a deliberate statement from the secretary of war, declared that the country is rapidly approaching in its history as a nation when we should have either to abandon the Monroe doctrine or fight for it. He added that we would never abandon it. Mr. Root presided over the dinner held in honor of the birthday of Ulysses S. Grant, and his reference to the Monroe doctrine, it is generally agreed, was designed as an official utterance of the McKinley administration. It is intended to express the belief of the president that it is possible for us to "eat his apple, and have it, too."

NO SYMPATHY FOR BOERS.
The Senate Monday by a Vote of Twenty For to Twenty-Nine Against, Rejected the Resolution.
Washington, May 1.—By a vote of 29 to 20 the senate Monday refused to consider the resolution of sympathy for the Boers introduced by Senator Mason, of Illinois. The detailed vote was as follows:

LAUDS THEIR PATRIOTISM.
Gov. Roosevelt Declares That Washington, Lincoln and Grant Are the Three Greatest Americans.
Galena, Ill., April 28.—Great crowds from adjacent towns gathered here Friday to participate in the services commemorating the birthday of Gen. U. S. Grant. The principal orator was Col. Theodore Roosevelt, of New York, who said, in part:
In the long run every great nation is built up by the people who are patriotic and patriotically represent its principles. How in our country we have had many public men of the first rank—soldiers, orators, constructive statesmen and popular leaders. Each one of these men has had his own group of devoted followers, and some of them have at times swung the nation with a power such as the foremost of all hardly wielded. Let us as the generations slip away, as the dust of conflict settles and as through the clearing air we look back with reverent vision into the nation's past, realize that among the mighty dead loom the three great figures of Washington, Lincoln and Grant.
