RE-ELECTION FALL INDICATED

Albuquerque, Nov. 7.—The re-election of Senator Fall to the U. S. senate, republican, is indicated this afternoon by incomplete returns. Hernandez, republican, is elected to congress.

This morning's reports on the election from Santa Fe indicated the reelection of Senator Fall and the entire republican state ticket by majorities ranging from 500 to 1,900 for Larrazola, who probably will lead the ticket. Fall's majority will be 1,500 or better. Raynolds, candidate for supreme court has small lead and an official count may be necessary to determine the result.

GERMAN NAVY IN HANDS OF REVOLUTIONISTS

London, Nov. 7.—The entire German navy and a great part of Schleswig is in the hands of revolutionists, according to reports received in Copenhagen from Kiel and transmitted by the Exchange Telegraph company. Governed by marines and soldiers of the workmen's council, all workshops are occupied by Red troops. Street car lines, and railways are under control of the workmen's council. There have been no disorderly disturbances.

With the American Army on the Sedan Front, Nov. 7.—American troops have entered that part of Sedan that lies on the west bank of the Meuse. The bridge over the Meuse at Sedan over which the retreating enemy fled was destroyed and the valley flooded.

The principal German lateral lines of communication between Metz and Northern France are unavailable for the enemy's use.

GERMANS HAVE NOT YET SIGNED AN ARMISTICE

Washington, Nov. 7.—It was officially announced at the state department at 2:15 o'clock this afternoon that the Germans had NOT signed the armistice terms.

Secretary Lansing authorized the statement that the German armistice delegation would not be received by Marshal Foch until 5:00 o'clock this afternoon.

Amsterdam, Nov. 7.—Chancellor Maximilian, says an official dispatch from Berlin, has issued an appeal to the German people saying: "In order to make an end of bloodshed" a deputation has already left Berlin for the French front and "negotiations will be seriously endangered by disturbances and lack of discipline at home."

Paris, Nov. 7.—Four German officers bearing white flags, it is officially announced, will probably arrive at headquarters of Marshal Foch tonight.

ARMY DESERTERS MARCHING THRU STREETS OF BERLIN

Sedan, famous in the Franco-Prussian war of 1870, has been entered by the American First army, marking an advance of more than 34 miles since the offensive began Sept. 26.

Meanwhile the British, French and American troops elsewhere on the front between Scheld and the Meuse are pushing the Germans from a small section of France they still occupy.

Important gains are chronicled for the British in north and the French in center of the advancing lines, which moved forward six miles Wednesday.
