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Coroner's Jury.

As previously announced, Judge Morrison as acting coroner ordered an inquest in the case of the killing of James Allen and George Davidson.

The following jury was empaneled on Sunday. Chas. Ifield, Serapio Romero, C. G. Green, Thos. Davis, Victor Masros and F. Knauer. A thorough examination of the bodies was made and late in the afternoon they were buried under direction of the sheriff.

The jury returned the following verdict: We, the undersigned, justice of the peace and jury, who sat upon the body of James Allen and George Davidson, at an inquest held this 15th day of November, 1880, find that they died from pistol wounds inflicted as shown on examination, by pistols in the hands of Desiderio Apodaca and Francisco Martinez, two men deputized for the purpose of taking the prisoners who made their escape from the jail and who were ordered to take them alive, or execute on them any other way, and that they fired on them, killing them as aforesaid, about seven miles northeast of Chaperito on the night of November 11th, 1880.
