

What Kingston is Doing. Black Range. This is the kind of mines we have in the little county of Sierra. While Henry Westerman was in Kingston the superintendent of the Lady Franklin mine received a dispatch from the owners of that mine to take on \$100,000 worth of this month.

Since the confirmation of the erection of the new mill the miners have resumed work with renewed energy. The owners of good properties who are absent and waiting for something to turn up, would do well to commence the development of their mines and help feed the mill. When the mill starts running it will rattle the mine owners to keep it going.

At Kingston the one absorbing theme of conversation was the great strike upon the Comstock mine. This bonanza is owned by Barton & Rugg and was leased to Charles Canfield who sold a half interest of his lease to Mr. Rontschel, for \$5,000, the lease expiring August 15th. Last week they struck an ore body which set the camp aglow. At present they have a face of big grade ore fifteen feet high and twenty-five feet wide with only one wall, and it is estimated that the mine is yielding \$10,000 a day. Very naturally the lessees are working all the force they can put on the mine and as the ore is increasing, although their lease is a short one, they will probably realize largely on their lucky prospect.

This mine is in the same belt with the Lady Franklin, Superior, Bullion, Black Coll and other noted properties and the district bids fair to make a second Nevada Comstock. Ore is found at the depth of 350 feet on the Superior. The formation is said to be very similar to that which is found in the great mines of Nevada.

Kingston is rapidly feeling the effect of these repeated strikes and the city will certainly be a booming one within a short time. A great drawback is the want of teams to haul the ore to the railroad. It is so dry that cattle cannot be worked and mule teams are in great demand.

The war department has made permanent the temporary order uniting New Mexico and Arizona in a military district.

John A. Downes has retired from the ranks of territorial journalism and will in future devote his attention to his cattle and other interests, having sold his half of the Silver City Enterprise to T. H. Tyndale, an experienced newspaper man, who has just arrived from the east.
