LIE DOWN TOGETHER**

**Japan Seeks Alliance With Russia In-
cluding Great Britain and France
to Deal With America.**
A dispatch to The Tribune from
Washington says: Official and dip-
omatic Washington is deeply in-
terested in the report emanating
from official sources to the effect
that Japan and Russia are paving
the way to the offensive and defen-
sive alliance in which Great Brit-
ain and France will participate.
If it be true, it will be the biggest
diplomatic coup which has occur-
red since the alliance between Eng-
land and Japan which made the
Russo-Japanese war possible. For
recent enemies, it will mean that
the armed truce which now pre-
vails, will give way to permanent
peace. The irritating attitude of
the American Pacific slope towards
Japan has caused statesmen of the
Mikado's empire to reckon with the
possibility of the United States as
an enemy and to deal firmly with
this country, it is necessary to
convert Russia to friendship.
