BOOSTERS FROM ROY TO SANTA ROSA

Judge E. V. Long, a prominent attorney of Las Vegas, was an appreciated visitor here last week. He was enroute to Santa Rosa to attend the district court, and visited here a day among his friends. Speaking of his trip over, he said:

"Dropping down from the Roy mesa through the Bell ranch to the lower altitude, the railroad before reaching Tucumcari passes across a wide leveled plain and here the houses visible from the car windows are to be seen in every direction. I counted thirty homestead houses, most of the tracts of land well fenced and having barns and wind mills at many places. Over 5,000 acres are fenced and settled upon near the line of the railroad within six miles of Tucumcari. Near this county seat, the improvements, houses, wind mills, barns, out-houses, fences and cultivation indicate thrift and prosperity. "Seeing is believing." In this particular locality I did not have to be shown; but I was shown.

During the past year Tucumcari has greatly improved. New residences are springing up in every direction and several creditable business houses have been erected and finished, while others are building. Onward, upward, progression seems the condition in Quay county. Many Las Vegasans are at Tucumcari. Among the most prosperous is D. J. Aber, the surveyor, whose many friends in the Meadow City will be pleased to hear that he is making a decided success in his new home.

Whitmore & Co., merchants, composed of J. E. Whitmore, the old timer of Gallinas Springs, John Whitmore and Henry Nefus are doing a thriving business. Colonel Heaman, well known to the old soldiers of our town, is doing a land office business and is among the public spirited citizens of the live and growing county seat of Quay.
