Catholic Education For Negroes.
The address of Booker T. Washington
in the churches of Providence, R. I.,
last Sunday show him to be an
educated man and a gentleman besides,
says the Visitor. No man in the
country, perhaps, should naturally be more
indignant at the treatment of his race
by the whites; and yet while Washington
spoke of dangerous ground, the
facts as he knew them, spared not
condemnation where he thought it
needed, no part of the country, be it
south or north, could take any offense
at what he said. He spoke for the
south and the north; he had blame, too,
which he spoke fearlessly; and withal
there was not a single harsh saying in
all his speeches. It was Booker T.
Washington, who said several
years ago that the only hope of the
colored man was in the Catholic church.
Here we have an example of what
education and Christianity can do for
the colored man.

Turkey and the Vatican.
It seems, says the Rome correspondent
of the London Telegraph, that
Turkey has been on the alert to obtain
any advantage that may be derived
from the existing discord between
France and the Vatican. Seizing the
opportunity afforded by the present
capture, the Porte immediately set on
foot negotiations for the establishment
of an Ottoman legation accredited to
the Holy See. This move is opposed
by the opinion prevailing in Ottoman
circles that the prostrate over Catholicism
in the east would pass from
France, and the object of the sultan
was to preserve its falling into the
hands of any other European power,
as by the establishment of a Turkish
legation the Vatican would be able
to regulate any eventual disputes by
direct negotiation with the sultan's
representative. Under the Hamidian
regime Turkey had already tried the
same tactics, but the idea was abandoned
after the receipt of a protest
from Rome. It is now believed that
the sultan will be the attitude of the
European powers if, in the event of
any difficulties of their Catholic
subjects in the east, the Vatican should
have recourse to the question
without their intervention.

Will Not Retain Esters.
The information given by the "Nouvelles
de Lyon" is confirmed by the
Paris correspondent of the Times, and
is, we may assume, correct. It is to
the effect that the holy father is
preparing to issue a series of practical
instructions to the bishops of France
about unity of action in the conduct
of Catholics, based on a clear, precise
system in order to ensure uniform
action. If there is to be any unity
between church and state, his holiness
wishes that it should be complete
and absolute, so that the church may
recovert to the freedom of the state as
soon as the part has been dissolved.
The bishops and priests, in order to
renew churches and reside in essential
places and presbyteries, still obliged
to have recourse to the government,
that would be according to the holy
father, worse servitude than before. In
other words, his holiness is taking
measures to defend the plan of
autonomy, it is to do all that lies in
the power of the church to bring
out the best in the state, and to
extinguish Christianity in France.
The pontiff is well aware that those
who try to rivet fetters on the church
when abolishing the concordat, their
efforts will prove vain, for if the clergy
are completely independent of the
government they cannot permanently be
deprived of freedom.—Liverpool Catholic
Times.

A dispatch from the City of Mexico,

 Hidalgo on Monday. The great church

thousands of camellias have been
brought from the hot country for the
floral display. Several archbishops will
be present. It is estimated that 20,000
persons will take part in the festivities.
