Letters for Cincinnati and other cities are carried by the Post Office, and the North should be mailed by 7.30 a.m. Letters for the South by three p.m. Owing to recent arrangements letters for Cincinnati may also be posted at three p.m. These letters will be delivered a few hours after those posted in the morning. A letter carried daily leaves the Post Office at 12.30 p.m., for Jamestown, Allardt, and places en route.

A PAIR HORSE CARRIAGE meets the train from Chattanooga, and the South, due at Rugby Road every morning (Sundays excepted) at 9.05, for the purpose of conveying travelers and the mails to Rugby.
