 200 feet within the memory of living  
 men and is now travelling toward Lake  
 Erie at the rate of fully 500 feet a  
 century. At present the crest of this  
 fall, as its name implies, has the gen-  
 eral outline of a horseshoe, and its  
 length is about 3,000 feet, but if the  
 present rate of erosion continues the  
 length of the crest may reach 8,000 feet  
 or more within the next half million-  
 um. Now the Canadian end of the

 from the spot whence Table rock has  
 fallen into the gorge, but the indica-
