The World is Interested.
H. W. Fletcher has left for Florida with George W. Young's Fiat racer of 110-horsepower. Fletcher will be accompanied by Emanuel Cedrino, who will take down another, owned by Hollander and Tangeman. Both cars will be thoroughly tried out on the beach course before the races beginning January 22. Different sprockets will be tested to ascertain which is the best for the going, and the effect of the atmospheric conditions on the carburetor will be studied. Fletcher's car is the one used by Lancia, in the Vanderbilt cup race. That is to be driven by Cedrino is the one used by Nazario in the same event.
The Minneapolis Automobile Club has offered a \$3,000 trophy for competition at the Ormond-Daytona meet. It is for stock or touring cars at five miles, and must be won three times by the same driver for permanent possession. In the general design of the trophy speed is symbolized by a racing tire encircling a silver globe. From the swirl evolve decorative bronze figures of Victory upholding a shallow silver bowl. The base is of ebony and onyx.
