is engaged in moving a supply of goods
from his store on Beach Street to the
Clareaudon, where he will open a branch
store early next week.

Complaint has been lodged at The

a great many bicyclists are taking the
the liberty to ride on the sidewalks.
There is an ordinance against riding on
the sidewalks.

A new 3-blade, 22-inch wheel with a
75-inch pitch capable of revolving 850
times a minute has been installed in the
Birchwood boat. The owners expect

of the boat.

An acetylene gas machine has been
