NEW ENGLAND TEACHERS MEET AT BOSTON TODAY.

BOSTON, Dec. 11.—The New England Association of English Teachers held its semi-annual meeting today at Boston University. The chief feature of the session was an address by Professor Otto Jespersen, professor of English in the University of Copenhagen.
