 An interesting experiment on "influence of plowing at different depths on soil temperature and moisture" is being conducted at the Oklahoma Experiment Station by Prof. Magruder. Forty plots of soil are plowed and subsoiled 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20 and 22 inches deep and will be planted to corn and oats. Temperature will be ascertained by soil thermometers and the moisture contained determined by evaporating the water from the soil samples taken from the plot.
