adopted by sections, as follows: CONSTITUTION. Article 1.

Section 1 -The name of this corporation shall be "The Beaver Cemetery Association," and shall have for its object the fencing. proving up and maintaining of cometery grounds in the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of section 25. township 4 north, rauge 23 E. C M. The life of this corporation shall be perpetual.

Article II. Sec. 1 .- The capital stock of this corporation shall consist of one hundred shares of the value of one dollar per share.

Article III. All persons of lawful age may become stockholders in this association. Women may hold stock in their own right, and minors by guardians or trustees.

Article IV. Sec. 1 .- The annual meeting of this association for the election of trustees and the transaction of such other business as may come before the association shall be held at such time and place as the by-laws may

direct. Sec. 2. -The trustees of this association shall meet once each mouth for the collection of subscription and the transaction of such other business as may come before said board, and such meeting shall be held at such time and place as the by laws may direct.

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
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
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
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
