If any one thinks that Beaver county soil will not produce as fine fruit as can be seen in other states we would respectfully ask that they investigate before they form a conclusion. Of course, our orchards are not so extensive as they might be—and as they soon will be, we might add—but this is not the fault of the tree but because fruit culture was not given the attention it should have had, in years gone by. Where orchards were planted and properly cared for, we find now the best fruit producers of the country. The fact that fruit raised on Uncle Jimmy Bare's farm on Clear creek, and which was entered in the Oklahoma exhibit at the St. Louis fair, was rejected as a forgery, the managers claiming the fruit was not raised in Oklahoma, goes to prove what kind of fruit our country can produce. Mr. Bare is not the only one who raises fruit either. There are many just as fine orchards as this one and it is only a question of a few years when just such fruit will be found on nearly every farm.

Wheat harvest will soon be on in this section. While the crop is not general, yet, there are a number of excellent fields of grain that will yield all the way from ten, fifteen and twenty bushels per acre. A number of fine fields of wheat were destroyed by the heavy hailstorms of the past few weeks but those that were missed by the hail are looking fine. Beaver county's wheat crop will compare favorably, according to the yield per acre, with the best wheat belts of Kansas and is ahead of many of the so-called wheat producing states. Under favorable circumstances, Beaver county soil will produce a yield of wheat second to no other wheat growing section. Wheat and most other small grains can be grown here successfully and can be counted as a sure year-after-year crop but, of course, like all other states, conditions like this season will occur and the crop will be limited. Taken all in all, however, we can count on small grain.

Wants Pumping Plant.

Englewood, Kan., June 22, 1907. Miss Maud Thomas, Beaver, Okla.

Dear Madam: Please find enclosed a copy of resolutions unanimously passed at a meeting of the citizens of this (Garland) township. We shall be pleased to have you publish these resolutions and will gratefully accept any influence you may use in aiding us in the protection of our rights.

Under the reclamation act Okla. is entitled to so much of the appropriation, and the officials have partly decided that this is the most desirable point for a pumping plant. In fact we are almost assured that this plant will go in but the fact that Englewood is so close to the line and has a railroad makes the citizens of that place feel that they would be justified in getting the most of the benefits that would be derived from Oklahoma's share of the reclamation fund.

As this would be a positive injury to this part of Beaver Co., we object to Englewood receiving any part of the appropriation intended for Oklahoma. We would be better pleased to have this plant located anywhere in Oklahoma than at Englewood. The work we have done toward defeating this proposition has begun to bear fruit and we are now more confident that we will get the plant. We intend to carry this matter into court if necessary but prefer gaining our object through the influence of the people of Oklahoma. There is no question but that if this is properly taken up we will win.

Any one who is interested in the welfare of Oklahoma should consider it a favor to have the opportunity to aid in the advancement of any enterprise that will be a lasting benefit to the coming great state.

RESOLUTIONS:

Garland Precinct, Beaver Co., Okla., June 20, 1907.

At a meeting of the citizens of Garland township, Beaver Co., Okla., we find that there is a concerted action of the A. T. & S. F. railroad, The Clearmont Land and Irrigation Co., The Englewood Improvement Co., with the help of prominent politicians to secure a pumping plant in Garland township, which we wish to encourage.

But there is also a disposition to locate the power plant at Englewood, Kansas, which would build up a city that would in no way lighten the burden of taxation, but would make this part of Oklahoma a subservient to Kansas.

Therefore be it Resolved--That it is the sense of this meeting that we request all the prominent men of all political parties to use their influence to secure this pumping plant, power, and all the other benefits to which we are entitled, under the Reclamation act, WHOLLY WITHIN OKLAHOMA, that we may build up cities, secure sugar plants, and railroads, thus enhancing the value of Oklahoma.

Resolved--That a committee be appointed and instructed to forward copies of these resolutions to leading officials, candidates, and other prominent men regardless of political affiliations.
