June 7, 1909.
Board of County Commissioners called to order and on account of only two members being present the Board adjourned until 1 o'clock P. M., June 8, 1909.

Board met at 1 o'clock P. M. June 8, 1909 pursuant to adjournment. Board adjourned until 3 o'clock P. M.

Board met at 3 o'clock P. M. pursuant to adjournment.

In the matter of the opening of the section line between sections fifteen and sixteen, township 2 north of range twenty-three E. C. M., the Board having failed to procure a right of way from T. D. Campbell on deviation from section line, it is ordered by the Board that the petition and proceedings be certified to the County Judge of Beaver County with request that he view and appraise the damages to the land of T. D. Campbell by reason of opening the deviation from the section line through a portion of the southwest quarter of section fifteen, township three north of range twenty-three E. C. M., and that he report his appraisal to this Board on the first Monday in July, 1909.

On motion a rebate was ordered issued to H. D. Peckham in the sum of \$11.21 on the NE 1/4 of section 31, township 5 north of range 24 E. C. M., same to be paid out of the sinking fund.

On motion the County Clerk was instructed to advertise for sealed bids for the job work for the County for the ensuing year, the County Commissioners reserving the right to reject any and all bids, each bid to be accompanied by sample of material.

On motion a rebate was ordered, issued to L. G. Nelson on the NW 1/4 section 22, township 5 north, range 28 E. C. M., on account of an erroneous assessment, same to be paid out of the sinking fund, in the sum of \$20.00.

On motion it is ordered by the Board that the court room is to be used only for courts, exercises of the Normal and educational purposes but all private entertainments and purely sectarian meetings are prohibited, except Friday night next.

On motion the Board adjourned until 7:30 o'clock P. M.

On motion the application for a rebate by Theodore Freeman was rejected.

On motion the bill of John K. Carr et al was rejected as not a proper charge against Beaver County.

On motion the Board adjourned until the first Monday in July.
