Ordinance No. 32.

An Ordinance for protection against fire in Blocks Numbered 58-59-105 and 106, of the Town of Beaver, Oklahoma, and to promote the public health.

Be It Ordained by the Board of Trustees, of the Town of Beaver, in Beaver County, Oklahoma, as follows, viz:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful hereafter to erect any building in Blocks Numbered 58-59-105 and 106, in the Town of Beaver, unless the walls thereof are of such non-combustible material as brick, stone, (artificial or natural), concrete or cement, having such fire walls, roofs and chimneys, as such Board shall deem sufficient, nor until after a permit thereof has been issued as hereinafter provided:

Provided, however, that privies and other outbuildings may be erected pursuant to the provisions of Section Number Four of this ordinance.

Section 2. Before beginning the construction of any building upon said lots in said blocks, the person proposing to erect the same shall submit to said Board of Trustees, the plans and specifications thereof, showing the form and plan thereof, and designating the lot upon which it is to be erected, showing the height of the fire walls, and the kind of material to be used in the construction of said building, and if cement be used in such construction, the percent thereof in proportion to the other material with which mixed, and said Board shall pass upon such plans and if approved, shall issue a permit authorizing such person to erect such building upon such lot designated, according to such approved plans, but if such plans and specifications be not approved the same shall be rejected:

Section 3. The Board of Trustees may issue a special permit permitting construction of a temporary building not complying with the requirements of Section 1 and 2 hereof, where it may be shown that such temporary building is necessary, pending the erection of other buildings. Provided, however, that such temporary building shall not remain on such lot for a period longer than ninety days.

Section 4. Privies or other outbuildings may be erected within said blocks, of any suitable material as may be approved by said Board.

Section 5. Any person who shall hereafter erect or attempt to erect any building within said blocks without such permit, or any person having received such special permit, allows any building constructed thereunder to remain thereon longer than ninety days, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum

of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00, and each day that such building so hereafter erected, or permitted to remain, after such conviction, shall be deemed a separate and additional misdemeanor for which he shall upon conviction, be punished in a sum of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00. And any such building so erected or permitted to remain, shall be deemed a nuisance.

Section 6. This Ordinance to take effect from and after its passage and publication, it being declared that the preservation of the public peace and safety has created an emergency.
