BOYS' AND GIRLS' WHEAT CLUB

Notice has just been received from Mr. John E. Swaim, of the Extension Division of the Oklahoma A. & M. College, that the seed wheat for the Beaver County Boys and Girls' Wheat Club has been bought and shipped and will be in Beaver and ready to deliver on Monday, October 15th, 1917.

We want everyone of the boys and girls who are in this club to be in Beaver on that day to receive their wheat. Come early and bring sacks to hold the wheat, for there are 315 boys and girls who will get five bushels each of this wheat and it will take all day to deliver it to them.

Mr. Swaim of the Oklahoma A. & M. College will be here, and probably others of the faculty of that institution. "Successful Farming," of Des Moines, Iowa, through whom this move is being financed, will have a representative here, and I am trying to arrange to have Mr. McMurdo, smut specialist of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, to be here and give a lecture on Grain Smuts and a practical demonstration in smut treatment and control.

County Supt. Ayers and State Supt. Wilson have held that children cannot be counted absent from school when they are out on club work, and no child will lose the time from school that it takes to come after his seed wheat.

Let every one come, without fail, and we will all get our seed wheat and make the day a general Club Rally day, and well worth while to everyone.
