## WHY NOT HAVE SOME WALKS?

After a long siege of rainy weather, which altogether too infrequent in Beaver county, and while the inconvenience of the muddy walks and street crossings is fresh in the mind of all of us, it occurs to us is a good time to agitate the matter of more walks and better street crossings for Beaver. This town is woefully in need of walks and crossings and we will never get them till we get busy and GET THEM so why not get busy right now. Even barring the mud, which some may argue does not occur often enough to justify the building of walks, the sand is just as bad or worse than the mud, and we need the walks on that account. Looking at the matter from an economical standpoint, to say nothing of the convenience, we really cannot afford to go longer without taking some steps toward the building of walks through the leading part of town, to the churches and schools. The saving in shoe leather alone would be no small item. We know whereof we speak for, living only three blocks off the walk yet having to cover those three blocks at least four times a day and some times oftener, in going back and forth to our office, we find that a perfectly good pair of shoes, regardless of whether we pay \$5.00 or \$12.00 for them, will wear us and be presentable for street wear not over three months and we have to exercise the greatest care to keep them going that length of time. With good walks we venture one pair of shoes would last us longer and look better than four pairs now do. The saving on shoes each year would be no inconsiderable item. Then think of the improved appearance of the town and the better impression made on visitors and that all counts, as sure as the world. If you think it does not, why do you brush up and attempt to look your best when going out of town or when expecting to meet friends or business associates. The Herald is not over-burdened with coin of the realm and we'd have some walks to build if the town should decide to brush up a bit in this way but we are ready and willing to do it if others will do the same. We believe it would be to the business interest of the town to have such walks as are so badly needed built and those interested in the town, or not interested for that matter but having property here, should get together and see what can be done. What about it?

H. D. Peckham had a very valuable Jersey cow injured last week, the animal being kicked by a horse and having its leg broken. Dr. Marshall, veterinarian, was called from Forgan and placed the broken leg in a plaster cast and it looks at this time, like the cow was going to soon have four good legs again.
