#### REPUBLICAN COUNTY CONVENTION

The Republican County Convention held at Beaver, Thursday afternoon of last week, was attended by a large number of delegates from all parts of the county, among whom the women were represented as well as the men, and a most enthusiastic convention was held.

The meeting was called to order by Roscoe Rizley, county chairman, and the call was read. Thos. P. Braidwood was county secretary. Temporary officers were chosen as follows: Roscoe Rizley, temporary chairman; Miss Maude O. Thomas, temporary secretary, and committees were appointed.

Credentials: W. L. Beardsley, of Forgan; A. A. Haskell, of Elmwood; John Taylor, of Gate; and Mrs. Beulah Thomas, of Beaver.

Resolutions: W. T. Quinn of Beaver; J. W. Steffen, of LeKemp; E. I. Haworth, of Gate; and Mrs. Ada Quinn, of Beaver.

Organization: A. M. Willis, of Elmwood; A. A. Quinn, of Beaver; W. G. Parker, of Knowles; and Mrs. Jane Stranathan, of Beaver.

After a short recess the committees reported as follows:

Organization: "We your committee on organization, respectfully submit the following order of business: Election permanent chairman and secretary; report of committees; election of delegates to state convention at Oklahoma City, February 11th; election of delegates to district convention at Enid, February 9th; election of county chairman, county secretary, state committee-man and congressional committee-man each for a term of two years; all nominations to be made in open convention." Report accepted and thereupon the temporary chairman and secretary were made permanent.

Resolutions: We, your committee on resolutions beg leave to submit the following report:

Resolved: That we, the representative Republicans of Beaver county, Oklahoma, in convention assembled, do hereby renew our allegiance to the principles of the Republican party as exemplified in the lives and policies of the great statesmen who formed and moulded the policies of the party, George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, Theodore Roosevelt and other great leaders of the Republican party, who have since the birth of the nation, warned this country against entangling alliances with European nations.

We congratulate the Republican party of the nation upon the great number of leaders and wise statesmen who will so shape and mould the policies of this country as to avoid entangling alliances and avoid surrendering the independence and nationality of this country, as exemplified by them in the senate and other such great leaders as are standing firm against surrendering the independence of this country. We emphatically declare against the incompetency and extravagance that has marked the administration of the Democratic party for the last eight years and so declare in favor of the strictest economy and good business judgment in the management of the affairs of the nation, the state, the counties, cities and towns.

We hereby declare that this is a representative form of government and no one man is big enough to be autocrat of the policies and destiny of this great nation. We hereby commend the course of the United States senate, in their defense of the independence of this country.

We are unalterable opposed to surrender to any international administrative body of the political or international independence of this country. We are willing to do our full duty in the future, as we have in the past to other nations of the world, but we refuse to permit any combination of nations of the world to dictate to this country what it shall or shall not do.

Be it further resolved, that since the women who are eligible and who may desire now to join us, and become a part of our great party, may we not as the senior leaders of the party be selfish, but may we recognize them for their great worth, and welcome them to our ranks as co-workers with us in solving all the great problems of our nation, state, cities and counties, and a welcome is hereby extended them and the hope expressed that they will share with us the full responsibility. We urge them to accept a full share, with the men, in being success to the Grand Old Party.

Be it further resolved, that we are opposed to compulsory universal military service in time of peace, as advocated by several leading congressmen of both parties, believing that our people in the future as they have in the past, will be possessed of sufficient patriotism to protect the honor of our nation when called upon.

C. O. Mendenhall, of Gate, was unanimously elected county chairman for a term of two years, and Miss Maude O. Thomas was unanimously elected county secretary for two years. W. T. Quinn was elected state committeeman and W. L. Beardsley, congressional committee for the same length of time.

Recognizing the woman voter and wishing to urge and encourage their interest in political circles without reservation, the matter was freely discussed in the convention and it was the unanimous wish of all present that Republican women of Beaver county receive full recognition with the men in the future conduct of the political affairs of the county. It was recommended that every precinct in the county be organized or re-organized to provide a place for the women in the official body governing the precinct and that women be given and urged to accept, equal representation with the men in all affairs of the precinct, county, state and nation.

A number of enthusiastic talks were made at the conclusion of the business session and much optimism felt and expressed for success in the coming campaign.

The Republican party in Beaver county is united in purpose. All parts of the county were well represented and a feeling of co-operation and confidence was apparent. It is just such united effort that brings results and it is the hope of the organization that all Republicans, men and women, will rally to the support of the Grand Old Party in the coming campaign as they have never rallied before, to the end that the principles of fairness and thorough Americanism, for which that party stands, first, last and all the time, may go on to complete victory.
