

CONVICT-MADE GOODS OUTLAWED

Confiscated by Treasury

Department

(By Associated Press,
Washington, March 25.—After a
vigorous partisan contest, the house
today passed a hill to bar foreign convict-made or pauper-made goods from competition with the products of American free labor. The measure, which now goes to the senate, follows a bill recently passed by the house forbidding the shipment of convict-made goods in interstate commerce into states which prohibit the sale of such products in the open market. Under the measure passed today

all shipments of goods proven to be convict or pauper made, could be con-fiscated by the treasury department throug court proceedings, similar to libel prosecutions under the admiralthei prosecutions under the admiral-ty laws. In addition the bill provides that any consigner, seller, owenr, shipper, importer consigner, agent or other phraons or persons, who "harwingly and fraudicatly" intro-duces or seeks to introduce the pro-hibited articles into the commerce of the United States. the United States, upon conviction shall be fined for each offense a sum not exceeding \$5,000 or be imprisoned for not exceeding two years.


