## MUST ENROLL ALL THE NAME

TO BE ABSOLUTELY SURE OF NOT BEING CHALLENGED IN PRIMARY

### MR. EVANS RULES

States That it Would be Better to Take No Chances on The Proposition Submitted

Ex-Gov. John Gary Evans, chairman of the state democratic executive committee, has written a letter to the chairman of the Anderson county executive committee, confirming the statement made over the phone Monday to The Daily Intelligencer with reference to the enrolling of names for the approaching democratic primary. The following is a copy of his letter to Mr. Dean and to Mr. Leola L. Ijice:

Dear Sir: Your letter to W. C. McGowan, secretary, has been forwarded to me. You make inquiry as to whether it is necessary that an applicant for membership to democratic clubs be required to enroll his full name. I desire to call your attention to Rule Eight, adopted by the state convention, May 20th, 1914. "Each applicant for enrollment shall in person write upon the club roll his full name, and immediately thereafter his age, occupation and postoffice address, etc. The question now before me is what is a man's full name. This is not a matter upon which there can be two opinions, as it has been decided by the highest courts in the country. "A man's full name in law is his Christian name and his surname. The law recognizes but one Christian name. An error in the middle name may be disregarded as surplusage. The omission of the middle letter between the Christian and surname is no misnomer and needs no remedy. This rule applies to ballots and votes." Keene vs. Margaret Meade Third Peters U. S. Reports, Page 1. You are aware of the fact that a great many persons are known by their middle names instead of by their first Christian names. For instance, John Thomas Arnold signs his name and is known as J. Thomas Arnold. On the other hand, John Tobias Arnold is known as John Arnold and signs his name J. T. Arnold. The object of the rule of the party was to identify these two Arnolds so that there could be no possible mistake in the one being allowed to vote in the name of the other. If these Arnolds were allowed to enroll as J. T. Arnold, it would lead to untold confusion, but if they are required to enroll as John Thomas Arnold and John Tobias Arnold, everybody will know who is meant, and there can be no confusion.

The Ruling. As chairman of the party, it is my duty, when called upon to make a ruling upon any rule of the party, to make a construction that will be an absolute protection to the voter and afford no loop hole through which trouble may arise. I do not pretend to say that a man who enrolls his name by his initials will not be allowed to vote, nor do I state that a man, who enrolls his first Christian name and leaves out the middle name, will not be allowed to vote, but I do say that a man enrolls his full Christian name and his surname, and if he has two Christian names and enrolls both Christian names and his surname, there is no power on earth that can prevent that man from voting.

He has compiled absolutely with the law, and nobody can gainsay it. Any other construction would leave the matter open to protest and probably the loss of a vote, and, therefore I urge our citizens to enroll their full names, and take no chances. Of course, you understand when a man's name is on the roll, the managers must allow him to vote unless that vote is protested, and in that case, he votes as a challenged poll, and the matter must be heard by the committee and it is possible to carry it into the courts. I have no hesitancy as a lawyer, in saying that a man who enrolls his name by his initials, does not comply with the rule of the party nor with the decisions of the highest courts in the land.

Passengers Rescued. Belgian Steamer Sent S. O. S. When Injured on Rocks. (By Associated Press.)

Scilly, England, June 23.—The Belgian steamer Gothland, Montreal for Rotterdam, laden with grain, struck Crim Rocks, near Bishop lighthouse, off Scilly Islands, in a dense fog today. Wireless calls for aid speedily brought the steamer Lyonesse from Penzance, two lifeboats from St. Mary's and the steamers Ascanius and Montezuma from Lizard Head.

The Gothland was badly damaged and a heavy sea made attempts to launch boats hazardous. The first boat fell from the davits and was smashed. The occupants of the boat were thrown into the water but a St. Mary's lifeboat rescued them.

A second boat was swung out but with no better success. Eventually, all passengers, numbering 130 emigrants, and 86 of the crew were transferred safely to the Lyonesse and landed at Hughtown, St. Mary's Island.

Several were injured. It is feared the Gothland will be a total wreck, although the captain, officers and some of the crew remained aboard.

The Gothland belongs to the Red Star Line but is under charter to the Canadian Line. She left Montreal June 12.

Pickard Heads Mercer. Macon, Ga., June 23.—Rev. Dr. W. L. Pickard, pastor of the First Baptist Church at Savannah, late tonight announced that he had accepted the presidency of Mercer University. One of the conditions under which he accepted was that a million dollar endowment fund be raised at once. The board of trustees promised to raise the fund.



### OLYMPIC CONGRESS ENDS

Delegates Gathered in Paris to Decide on Games.

Paris, June 23.—Delegates to the International Olympic Congress, in session here since June 15, virtually have finished their labors, although several minor decisions are to be reached. American delegates declare they will return here thoroughly satisfied with the results attained.

James E. Sullivan, head of the American delegation today said the work of the congress would have a far reaching effect, especially in the United States. In all the large American cities preliminary games will be held and the winners will meet in New York the first Sunday in June 1916, for the grand elimination trials to decide the entries for the Olympic games to be held that year at Berlin. The American Olympic team will comprise the men taking the first six places in big events and the first three places in small events. Rules governing all sports will be published September 1.

### Tried in Bad Weather.

Southampton, June 23.—The British challenger for the America's cup, Shamrock IV, had her first weather trial today with the older Shamrock and acquitted herself well. In a stiff northwesterly breeze the challenger worked out a three minute lead in a five mile run.
