# ANDERSON GIRLS ARE TO CAN TOMATOES

## CLUBS WILL SOON BE ORGANIZED HERE

## GIRLS ARE PLEASSED

County Delegation Has Agreed to Make Necessary Appropriation to Aid With Work.

As a result of a conference held yesterday between Miss Edith L. Parrott and the Senator-elect from Anderson county and the representatives-elect, it is definitely announced that Anderson county girls will soon have an opportunity to join the canning club work, which is being vigorously prosecuted in all parts of the State.

Miss Parrott is one of the best known figures in the State. She has done wonders in interesting girls in canning tomatoes and fruits and this year almost half the counties in the State had girls' canning clubs and did splendid work. The value of the work is apparent and has never been disputed.

Miss Parrott had planned to bring W. W. Long of Clemson College with her to Anderson but Mr. Long was unable to come and therefore when the meeting was held at the Chamber of Commerce yesterday afternoon Miss Parrott alone presented the application for aid from the delegation in securing enough funds to get the work started here.

A joint appropriation of \$225 is made by Winthrop College and the Federal government for any county in the State raising \$675 to supplement this amount and to get the work under way. It is understood that 25 of the 30 possible counties have already agreed to the proposition and therefore the local delegation debated but a short time yesterday afternoon when it was put squarely up to them. They agreed to incorporate the item of \$675 in the county appropriation bill and accordingly it is now settled that some worker will be sent here to take charge of the undertaking and teach Anderson county girls how to lower the "high cost of living."

In discussing the matter Miss Parrott said that she was indeed well pleased that Anderson county should become interested in the work because it is no more than natural that "the principal agricultural county in the State" should desire to do everything possible to promote more economic conditions throughout the county.

## BATTLE RESUMED WITH VIOLENCE

Losses Among the Officers and Crew Said to Have Been Very Heavy.

PARIS, Nov. 10.—The battle was resumed today with all its former violence from the North Sea to Arras. Undeterred by losses, the Germans again returned to the charge.

All along the line from the sea to the Vosges Mountains there is no flank on which to carry out their favorite enveloping maneuver and the Germans are trying to create one by piercing the battle line in a frontal attack south of Dixmude.

The progress of the Allies is satisfactory though not rapid, according to returning officers. A celebrated French general prevented by age from taking an active part in the campaign and whose name cannot be given, said today:

"It seems the situation of the Allies is excellent, quite apart from the Russian victory. The Germans not only have reinforced their fighting units of every kind, but have created new army corps, the greater part of which they have sent to Belgium and the north of France.

"I consider it remarkable that our forces have done so well against the German effort. It seems that the situation has changed greatly to our advantage during the past month. At the end of September the two armies faced each other along a straight line from Verdun to Compiègne. Today our front is a right angle, effecting an enveloping form in a right angle effecting an enveloping form. This is a maneuver the Germans applied with partial success at the beginning of hostilities.

"They are making their decisive efforts simultaneously on our left around Verdun. Those are the two points most vital to the Germans, since in the event of success on our part their lines of communication would be placed in danger."

## Will Carry Campaign to Victorious Conclusion

LONDON, Nov. 10.—(10 p. m.) The splendid pluck and endurance shown by my troops in the desperate fighting against vastly superior forces, fills me with admiration. I am confident of the final result of our noble efforts under your able command.

This commendation of the British expeditionary force has been communicated to Sir John French, commander in the field, by King George. General French replying has thanked His Majesty for the message, which he said had been received with gratitude and pride by the army. He assured the king "of our unalterable determination to uphold the highest tradition of Your Majesty's army and carry the campaign through to a victorious conclusion."

# Demands Concession For A Railroad

## Head of the Hierarchy in Turkey Has Prepared an Announcement That Every Mohammedan Fighting on the Side of the Entente Powers Is Not a Warrior But a Murderer.

BERLIN, Nov. 10.—(By wireless)—The Novoye Vremya, a Petrograd newspaper, reports that Japan has demanded from China a concession for railroad from Tai-Nan, in Shantung province, to the Yangtze river. This information was given out today from official sources. Other official information follows:

"The Sheik-ul-Islam, head of the hierarchy in Turkey, has prepared an announcement that every Mohammedan fighting on the side of the entente powers is not a warrior but a murderer and liable to religious punishment.

## Generals Commanding 50,000 Men Relieved of Commands

### Refused to Nullify Their Action in Signing an Agreement to Obey Aguas Calientes Convention—Fighting of a Severe Character Continues in the Suburbs of the Capital.

MEXICO CITY, Nov. 10.—Generals commanding 50,000 men in this vicinity were relieved of their commands today by General Venustiano Carranza, because they refused to nullify their action in signing an agreement to obey the Aguas Calientes convention. Among these soldiers are General Benavides, General Antonio Villarreal, General Juvenilio Robles and many others.

It is reported that General Villa's advance guard of 15,000 men is marching south of Encarnacion de Diaz on its way to the capital, which is said to have to be ordered to take in the name of Eulalio Gutierrez. Between these troops and their goal is General

Pablo Gonzales, loyal to Carranza, with 40,000 troops disposed about Queretaro City. A clash is expected there.

In the capital there are 27,000 men, according to official figures. Fighting of severe character continues in the suburbs of the capital. Persistent attacks are being made by Zapata followers. During the fighting last Sunday it is reported there were 300 casualties.

## GOVERNMENT WORK BETTER DONE BY FEWER PEOPLE UNDER MERIT SYSTEM

### Chief Speaker at American Road Congress Claims \$20,000,000 Is Saved Annually by Government Through Operation of Competitive Merit System.

ATLANTA, Ga., Nov. 10.—The claim that twenty million dollars annually is saved the United States Government through the operation of the competitive merit system in making appointments was made here today by Richard Henry Dana, of Cambridge, Massachusetts. Mr. Dana, who is chairman of the council of the National Civil Service Reform League, was one of the chief speakers at the American Road Congress, now meeting here.

"Government work is far better done by fewer people under the merit system," said the speaker. "It is now one of the objects of the National Civil Service Reform League to arouse public opinion so as to compel Congress to allow the high postmasters, the collectors and the like to be

"Third, the duty of the Daughters of the Confederacy is to keep fresh the memory of the brave men who wore the gray. Let them be cherished, now that the snow that ever melts has fallen on their heads, by the knowledge that sons and grandsons hold them in honor and point to their service as illustrative of the noblest knights of the race."

Mrs. Daniels paid tribute to Mrs. Woodrow Wilson as "the best type of Southern womanhood."

"When the whole nation mourned her unlamented death," she said, "there was a solemn pride in the South that the home of her youth was selected for her last repose. Her memory will live in the hearts of all her countrywomen, but here in the South it will be our privilege, as we decorate the graves of Southern heroes, to ever keep green her last resting place and emulate her virtues, her graciousness and her practical helpfulness."

In her address Mrs. Stevens defended secession. "Some may doubt the wisdom of secession," she said, "but none can question the right. Long before the war between the States, Massachusetts had threatened to secede and a Republican president had conceded her right to do so. At West Point, Davis, Lee and Jackson were fought allegiance to their State."

Mrs. Stevens' address was a eulogy of the Confederacy and the men who fought for the lost cause.

## Georgia Bankers Hold Meeting at Atlanta

ATLANTA, Ga., Nov. 10.—The Georgia Clearing House Association was formed here today at a meeting attended by representatives of sixty-five banks of the State. While National Banks are not barred from membership, the organization is primarily intended to give to State banks the same clearing facilities that will be afforded members of the new Federal Reserve System. Headquarters will be maintained here.

## Houston Becomes a Deep Water Port

HOUSTON, Texas, Nov. 10.—Houston officially became a deep water port today when President Wilson, by pressing a button at the White House, fired the signal in this city announcing that the Houston ship channel was a reality.

The new waterway cost millions of dollars. It has a minimum depth of 25 feet from the business section of the city to the sea, and a minimum bottom width of 100 feet. Wharves and like conveniences remain to be constructed but bonds to the extent of \$3,000,000 have been voted for the purpose.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10.—President Wilson interrupted the cabinet meeting today at noon to touch a button opening the celebration marking the completion of a deep water channel at Houston, Texas. The cabinet meeting today was the first regular one in several weeks.

## Bequeaths Estate to Religious Organization

PITTSBURGH, Pa., Nov. 10.—The will of Miss Letitia Denton, who died here last week, bequeaths almost her entire estate, estimated at \$500,000, to religious and philanthropic organizations. Among specific bequests were:

Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions, \$150,000; Presbyterian Board of Home Missions, \$50,000; Young Women's Christian Association of New York, \$50,000; Humane Society of New York, \$50,000.

Three-fourths of the residue is left to the Presbyterian Foreign Board and one-fourth to Home Board.

## Large Number of Merchant Vessels Sunk

LONDON, Nov. 11.—15:25 a. m.—An Exchange telegram from Constantinople says the Russian Cruisers have bombarded the forts in the Bosphorus and the coal magazines at Heraclea, Asia Minor. The Turkish fleet sailed out against the Russians, but soon withdrew. At Heraclea the Russians sunk a large number of merchant vessels.

## GERMAN LIEUTENANT SHOT

(Continued From Page One)

In London late in September charged with espionage, and at his trial testified that he was a former lieutenant in the German navy but that he had been transferred to the reserves.

Lody said he was ordered to go to England and keep track of the British fleet, but was warned not to do any spying. He was told to travel as an American citizen "and in consequence of that I received an American passport," he said. He claimed membership in several New York societies. Last year Lody served on Emperor William's yacht Meteor.

The prosecutor, summing up, said Lody had admitted being an alien enemy, posing as a civilian—at times as an American—meanwhile communicating important information to Germany. He described the prisoner as one "upon whom the international law against spies should be imposed."

The defence admitted that Lody was a German lieutenant and said he had taken the risks because he thought it was his highest duty to do so. Lody's attorney asked for a sentence less severe than death but said if the full penalty were exacted Lody would face orders to make an attack, it concludes.
