



Fair at Easley October 23-24

The Directors of the Pickens County Agricultural and Mechanical Association met in the City Hall, by call of President W. W. Robinson, at 4:30 o'clock p. m., Oct. 3d, 1913.

The following committees for the Fair Association to be held Oct. 23 and 24 were appointed: Committee on Live Stock—J. B. Jameson, chairman; W. D. Sifton and H. C. Hagood.

Committee on Agricultural Implements—W. D. Spearman, chairman; A. L. Campbell, W. L. Pickens.

Committee on Agricultural Products—J. Milton King, J. T. Latham, W. A. Hamilton.

Committee on Music—W. W. Robinson, Dr. H. E. Russell.

On motion of Dr. H. F. Smith, seconded by W. D. Spearman, City Council was made a committee on arrangements for speakers and place for speaking during the fair, and any other entertainments that in Council's judgment would contribute to the interest of the fair.

It was moved and carried that the schools be requested to give a parade Friday afternoon of the fair.

Committee on Domestic Science—Mrs. J. A. Jones, Mrs. J. L. Camp, Miss Gladys Smith.

Committee on Fancy Work—Mrs. A. B. Mathews, Miss Frances Robinson, Miss Lexie Bowen.

Committee on Arrangement of Fowls and Rabbits—William McMahan, P. H. Sellers, E. M. Smith.

It was moved and carried that the chairman of each committee, with the chairman of the Association, secure judges for each department of the fair.

Was moved and carried that chairman of Live Stock Committee confer with City Council in regard to arrangements for the Old Fiddlers' Convention.

Was moved and carried that the chairman of the Association, with the chairmen of the different committees prepare a general program for the fair.

It was agreed by meeting, that T. Latham, mayor of the city, make an address of welcome on the day of opening of the fair, and that Mr. W. C. Smith deliver an address on the purpose and intention for which the Pickens County Agricultural and Mechanical Association was organized, also the purpose of holding the fair.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned subject to the call of the Chairman.

Tax Notice.

Pickens County Treasurer, Pickens County, S. C., October 1, 1913. Notice is given for the collection of State and County taxes for the year 1913 to December 31st, 1913. The taxes will be open from October 1st to December 31st, 1913. Those who prefer to do so can pay in January, 1914, with 1 per cent additional. Those who prefer to pay in February, 1914, can pay 2 per cent additional. Those who prefer to pay in March, 1914, to the 15th of said month, can pay an additional 7 per cent. After that date the taxes will close.

N. B.—Tax payers owning property or paying tax for others, will please ask for tax receipt in each township or special school district in which he or they may own property. This is very important as there are so many special school districts. Those who do not wish to come to the office can write me, not later than December 31st, and I will furnish them with the amount due and they can remit me by check, money order or registered letter, if stamps are sent do not send above two cent stamp as I cannot use them. Please do not send me cash without stamps, same as it is liable to get lost; if sent otherwise it must be at sender's risk.

Pickens' Nine Banks

The Columbia State of October 9 contained an interesting bankers' section, which gave reports from banks in all counties of the State. The following is the report from this county:

Pickens, Oct. 8.—There are nine banks in Pickens county located as follows: Two at each of the towns of Pickens, Easley, Liberty and Central, and one at Norris.

The banking institutions of this county are controlled by safe and conservative men, having great resources and are in excellent shape.

The bank officials of this county are very accommodating and the people have implicit confidence in them.

Some of the strongest banks in the State, in proportion to the capital stock, are located in Pickens county. The Old Pickens bank in the town of Pickens has a capital stock of \$20,500, surplus \$29,000 and undivided profits \$11,000, in addition to the beautiful bank and office building which it occupies.

Others in the county are nearly as strong. The banks of Pickens are prosperous and well prepared to take care of the business of the county.






